WHO WE ARE

Athletes Unlimited is a new model of professional sports where athletes are decision makers and individual players are champions of team sports. We literally change the game with faster play and fluid teams, delivering next-level competition and engagement in which every moment counts. Beginning in 2020 with Women's Softball and following with Women's Volleyball (2021), Women's Lacrosse (2021), Women's Basketball (2022) and AUX Softball (2022), Athletes Unlimited will build the next generation of both athletes and fans.

Our athletes are in charge of their team and league decisions, and of their individual success. We reboot timetables, rosters, and gameplay to create fast and exciting competition that speaks to contemporary sports fans, bringing them close to the action and the athletes in games where every moment counts. We incorporate the player-centric model that fans love about fantasy sports. We use digital media platforms and cutting-edge technology to connect fans deeply to athletes at the top of their game on and off the field, and to the game itself.

HOW THE TEAMS ARE SELECTED

A draft will be held prior to each series of games with the top four players on the individual leaderboard serving as the team captains. The captains will then fill their rosters by selecting 14 other players. Each draft will be held on the Monday prior to each week's games.

Uniform colors will be assigned based on the team captain's rank on the leaderboard. The top-scoring captain's team will wear gold, while the second-highest point scorer's team dons orange jerseys. The third-place team will wear blue jerseys during each series and the fourth-place team wears purple jerseys.

Each team will consist of 15 players, including four pitchers, two catchers, three middle infielders, three corner infielders and three outfielders.

RULES OF INTEREST

Game Duration: Each Athletes Unlimited Softball game will consist of seven (7) innings regardless of the game's score. If the visiting team scores in the top of the seventh inning but trails in the game, the home team will bat in the bottom of the inning in an attempt to win the inning points.

Extra Innings: Team inning points and individual stat points are not earned in extra innings. Only inning points that have carried over from the seventh inning and team game win points can be accumulated.



Captain's Challenges: Each captain will be permitted two (2) video review challenges per game, which will be sent to the replay official for a final decision. A challenge must be indicated by one of the two designated team representatives either verbally or visually before the next pitch is thrown, before all members of the infield have left their positions and fair territory, or before the umpires have left the field of play. A challenge is indicated visually by tapping the top of the head with one hand.

In addition, umpires are allowed to initiate a video review of any call in the reviewable plays list once the game reaches the sixth inning.

The following plays can be reviewed:

1. Whether a batted ball called fair, is fair or foul.
2. Whether a batted ball called a ground-rule double or home run is fair or foul.
3. Whether a batted ball called foul that could result in a ground-rule double or home run is fair or foul.
4. Decide scoring players at home plate, including collisions (illegal and/or malicious slides), obstruction by a defensive player or timing plays
5. Force tag/play calls
6. Hit-by-Pitch calls
7. Placement of Runners
8. With runners on base, a no-catch call can be changed to a catch only if it results in a third out. With no runners on base, a no-catch call can be changed to a catch at any time.
9. If the ball left the field of play on a home run
10. All aspects of a scoring play or timing play
11. Obstruction and interference at any base, only if the play in question results or would result in the third out of an inning and relates to a scoring/timing play
12. Malicious/flagrant contact
13. Deciding on a foul tip/foul ball at the plate, including a dropped strike

INDIVIDUAL LEADERBOARD

While traditional softball statistics are kept during each Athletes Unlimited Softball game, players earn individual points by accumulating those statistics. Points accumulated by statistics, inning and/or game wins and MVP selections are used to create an individual leaderboard, which determines captains for each week and the individual champion at the end of the season.

Points are awarded at the following increments for hitters during the game:

Single	+10 Points
Double	+20 Points
Triple	+30 Points
Home Run	+40 Points
Stolen Base	+10 Points
Caught Stealing	-10 Points
Base on Balls	+8 Points
Hit By Pitch	+8 Points
Sacrifice Fly/Bunt	+10 Points

In addition, pitchers can earn individual points for the following statistics:

Out Recorded	+4 Points
Earned Run Allowed	-10 Points

Athletes will be awarded 10 individual points if their team wins a single inning. If the teams score the same number of runs in an inning, the points carry over to the next inning.

Athletes on the winning team in each game will be awarded 50 individual points toward the individual leaderboard. The total score determines the overall game winner, which means a team may lose multiple innings, but still win the overall game.

A total of three MVPs will be selected following each game by the athletes with the top player earning 60 points. The second MVP receives 40 points, while the third MVP claims 20 points.



POSTSEASON AWARDS

At the conclusion of the 2022 Athletes Unlimited Softball season, medals will be presented to the top four finishers on the leaderboard in addition to the Defensive Player of the Year presented by GEICO and the Rookie of the Year. An All-Defensive Team will also be honored as part of the closing ceremony.

ATHLETE COMPENSATION

Athletes are compensated in three ways during an Athletes Unlimited season, including base pay, win bonuses (inning and game wins) and a leaderboard bonus. The leaderboard bonus also includes an additional donation equal to half of the athlete's leaderboard bonus to their selected cause partner.

MEDALS

The top four players on the season's final leaderboard in addition to the Defensive Player of the Year presented by GEICO will receive a medal designed and fabricated for Athletes Unlimited by Lisa Issenberg, founder of Kiitellä, inc. The front face of the medal represents the identity of Athletes Unlimited, while the back face of the medal leans into the specific sport, the year, location and words about Athletes Unlimited's vision, mission and values on and off the field - Excellence in Community and Leadership.

THE BOOK OF UNLIMITED

The Book of Unlimited was designed, handmade and bound for Athletes Unlimited. The book weighs nearly 25 pounds, measures approximately 12" by 18" and contains nearly 500 pages. The champion, along with all who competed, are inscribed into the book. In addition, The Book of Unlimited also contains a history of achievements in Athletes Unlimited, including stories, highlights and events.

The book is opened during the Opening Ceremony for each season and is closed after the champion is named and her name is inscribed into the book. The tradition began during Athletes Unlimited Softball's inaugural season in 2020.

2022 SEASON NOTES



AN EMPTY PITCHER

Week Three and Week Four marked the first times in Athletes Unlimited Softball history where a pitcher did not serve as a team captain, ending a streak of 12 straight weeks with at least one pitcher serving as a team captain. Pitcher **Alyssa Denham** was a team captain in Week Five.

TWO OF A KIND

Outfielder **Haylie McCleney** and infielder **Amanda Chidester** each tallied 500 or more leaderboard points during Week Two, marking the sixth time in league history that two or more players reached the 500-point plateau in a single week. Since the start of the 2020 campaign, a player has fashioned 500 or more points in a week 17 times.

EXCLUSIVE COMPANY

Infielder **Amanda Chidester** joined pitchers **Aleshia Ocasio** and **Cat Osterman** as the only players in Athletes Unlimited Softball Championship Season history with multiple 500-point weeks after finishing Week Two with 508 points. Ocasio owns three career 500-point weeks, while Osterman and Chidester hit the 500-point plateau twice.

GOOSE EGGS

After posting just seven shutouts in the first two seasons of Athletes Unlimited Softball Championship Season play, teams had four shutout efforts during the 2022 campaign. Team Eberle blanked Team Ocasio by a 1-0 count on July 30 before a pair of shutouts took place on Aug. 21 with Team Chidester and Team Mulipola earning the wins. Team Denham claimed the final clean sheet with a 4-0 decision over Team Mulipola on the penultimate day of the season.

TWO FOR THE PRICE OF ONE

The Week Four finale doubleheader on Aug. 21 ended with a pair of shutout verdicts, signaling the first time in Athletes Unlimited Softball history that both games in a single day were decided in shutout fashion. Team Chidester blanked Team Jaquish by a 1-0 count while Team Mulipola secured a 3-0 victory over Team McCleney.

ONE IS THE LONELIEST NUMBER

The July 30 contest between Team Eberle and Team Ocasio marked the first time in the three-year history of Athletes Unlimited Softball history where a game ended with a 1-0 score. Team Eberle scored the game's lone run in the second inning on a RBI single by infielder **Kelsey Harshman**.

MIGHT NEED SOME WHITE OUT FOR THAT

Team McCleney and Team Chidester combined to score 25 runs in the highest-scoring game in Athletes Unlimited Softball Championship Season history in the first game of a doubleheader on Aug. 20. The game featured several single-game records, including:

- Team McCleney scored the most runs (20) in a single game in league history
- Outfielder **Haylie McCleney** set a single-game record with six at-bats
- Outfielder **Amanda Lorenz** accumulated six runs batted in, tying the single-game record set by **Amanda Sanchez** against Team Sanders on Sept. 14, 2020.

INSIDE THE NUMBERS

Here are some additional notes on Team McCleney's record-setting 20-5 triumph over Team Chidester from Aug. 20:

- Team McCleney scored seven runs in the second and sixth innings.
- Every player who went to the plate reached base at least once ... In addition, every starter also registered a hit, including six starters with two or more hits.
- Team McCleney tallied 12 of its 20 runs with two outs ... Outfielder **Amanda Lorenz** also collected all six of her runs batted in with two outs.
- Team McCleney's four home runs tied a league season high ... Team Zerkle belted four home runs against Team Eberle on July 31.
- Team McCleney's nine walks were a league single-game season high.
- Team McCleney's 17 hits equaled the most in a game this season ... Team Mulipola also had 17 hits during Week Two against Team Eberle.
- The first four hitters in Team McCleney's lineup went 7-for-15 while scoring 10 runs with 13 runs batted in.
- Pitcher **Mariah Mazon** threw a season-high 5.0 innings while claiming her second victory of the season.
- Team McCleney was 20-for-30 in advancement opportunities.

THE LOVE BEHIND A NAME: THE ROMERO FAMILY

The Romero household has always been competitive.

The oldest siblings, Sierra and Sydney, would race to the car as kids to see who was faster. As Mikey and Sophia, the younger of the four got older, they all contended in the batting cages to test who could hit the back of the net most.

It's in that backyard batting cage in Temecula, Calif., and across the southern region of the state that Sierra and Sydney developed against some of the best in softball. The story of the familial power duo is familiar to fans: one went to Michigan to set NCAA records, the other to Oklahoma to win multiple national championships. All the while both were stellar middle infielders. They're the most well-known siblings in the sport.

As their professional journeys have taken them around the world, timing and injuries have held the siblings back from reuniting on the field.

Thirty-two and two, shortstop and second base.

A lifetime of softball led to AUX being the moment that brought not only the set of sisters together but their whole family.

"We felt that connection being back in the middle together and it was the same thing in high school," Sydney said. "And to see our family in the stands, just being able to see that their first time seeing us play really professionally together, it was really special."

It's no small task to raise a kid chasing their athletic dreams to the highest level. Melissa and Mike Romero do it for four: fees for travel balls teams; packing snacks and lunches; driving to and from the ballpark.

"My parents definitely sacrificed a lot," Sierra said. "There are things I'm sure they would've wanted to do, but instead they were at a softball field for 10 hours because we got to the loser's bracket."

From starting tee-ball at age four to Athletes Unlimited at 28, Sierra could always look into the stands and see her parents. This time, they were there for her return from injury. She's spent over a year training, rehabbing, and recovering from ACL and meniscus injuries.

AUX was her breakout debut. She finished with the third-best batting average in the league, hitting .409. She tied as the RBI leader with 11 and knocked a signature "RomBomb."

With the mentality instilled by her dad Mike, she's always chasing perfection.

"We can go two-for-four and he's like, 'What happened those other two at-bats?'" Sierra laughed. "He's always pushing us and challenging us to do more, be better and never settle."

Sydney recalled looking up into the stands during an at-bat and mouthing to him, "What do you see?" He commented back and she followed with a hit to left-center.

"All I have to do is look at him," Sydney explained. "One thing he says, it'll just click and I'll get myself going."

Mike Romero analyzes his kids through the same lens he did for himself. Watching at San Diego State University, it's even on the same campus as his college career; Mike played four years as an Aztec.

Full circle, meant to be, kismet. Whatever you want to call it, AUX in San Diego is where it all aligned for the Romero family to do what they do best: support one another.

While Sydney and Sierra practiced, Mike and Melissa were at Petco Park with Mikey for the MLB Draft Combine. Then for Mike and Melissa to both to be in the stands for an AUX game day, Mikey drove their sister Sophia to her softball games with the OC Batbusters.

"We really are just like a little team and we just try to help out whenever we can," Sierra said.

This bond and love are difficult for the sisters to encapsulate in words.

Recently, Sierra inked it on her skin. Their legacy, their name: Romero.

"There's my whole left arm... to me, it's like a story. Different parts and pieces that I've gotten are when I have felt certain ways or things that I've experienced," Sierra explained. "So when I got the Romero tattoo, it's like the development of me becoming a Romero."

Family, craziness, love, passion, determination, and a whole lotta good food. All things Sierra and Sydney described are wrapped into the name they wear proudly on their jerseys.

"My arm is hopefully gonna be a collage of different things that got me to become a good Romero," Sierra added. "I know what it means to my family – my dad and my mom have set great examples of what that means so I just strive to be like them every single day."



ATHLETES UNLIMITED IS NEXT STOP FOR ITALIAN PITCHER GRETA CECCHETTI

If you check the arrivals board at O'Hare International Airport in Chicago, you may see that Greta Cecchetti's ETA to Athletes Unlimited is set for late July – after a delay of a year.

The wait should be worth it.

Athletes Unlimited is getting a world-class pitcher who helped put Team Italy on the map in world softball.

And the 33-year-old Cecchetti will get a chance to play with and against the top professional softball players in the world.

Cecchetti has plied her trade around the world. That includes a recent stay in Japan, where she pitched for SGH Galaxy Stars. Athletes Unlimited will be her latest stop in a softball journey that began in her hometown of Bollate, Italy. That's just one reason for the excitement.

"I could think of a million reasons," she said about playing for Athletes Unlimited. "Just the chance to be part of such a big event and everything they stand for. It's not just the softball. It's playing for a cause and giving women's softball and women's sports visibility in everything they do. It's just great for the sport and being part of that and just being part of a pool of 60 athletes who are the best softball athletes in the world. It doesn't get any better than that."

It's been a whirlwind past year for Cecchetti. She pitched for Team Italy in the Tokyo Olympics last summer, putting up an ERA of 3.44 in 18.1 innings pitched. She was set to join Athletes Unlimited for its second season in Rosemont, but she was unable to obtain a visa in time.

"Because of COVID, they cut down a lot of visa appointments," she said. "I couldn't get my appointment in time. I couldn't come weeks late because it's (the AU season) only five weeks. Unfortunately it didn't work out. But I'm good with the visa now."

ACROSS THE GLOBE

Cecchetti's softball journey began in her home country of Italy, which is gaining a foothold in both softball and baseball. Like many athletes who eventually find their sport, it took some trial and error for Cecchetti before she fell in love with softball.

"When I was little I tried different sports," she said. "I am very tall (6 feet), and I was very tall growing up – and very uncoordinated. I wasn't good at anything, let's just say that. Let's be honest. My aunts played softball, and they represented Italy, as well. So they said, 'Why don't you try it. It's fun. It's a sport that allows different body types, and you can definitely grow and improve with that.'"

"Bollate, my hometown, is pretty much like a softball capital in Italy. Everybody in Bollate knows about it. Maybe not everybody in Italy knows about softball, but everybody in Bollate knows what softball is because we have such a big tradition. So I started playing when I was seven and never stopped."

Cecchetti kept refining her softball skills, and while attending the Italian Softball Academy in Tirrenia, she caught the eye of U.S. softball and coaching legends Jay Miller and Susie Parra, who helped her create a profile, which led to her coming to the States to study and play softball at Polk State College in Florida before she headed to Texas A&M-Corpus Christi.

"During high school, they opened this baseball and softball academy that was financed by MLB," Cecchetti said. "It was mainly a way for MLB to find prospects for the minor leagues. The federation decided to put some funds for softball into that, too. As soon as I heard that, I signed up and did a tryout. That year they selected only six softball players. That meant I had to move away from home for my last years of high school. The academy was in Tuscany. That's about a five-hour train ride from home."

"That's kind of what made me think about college because I was already away from home, going to school in the morning, practicing every day. It kind of resembled what college is like. I knew a couple of baseball guys

who were looking into that. They got me to start thinking about, 'Oh, I love softball. I want to keep studying, but I don't really want to do it in Italy, and I know softball is great in the U.S.A., so let's look into that.'"

There was a period of adjustment at Polk for Cecchetti, who was learning a new language and adapting to a new culture.

"Yes, it was tough at the beginning," she said. "My English was not good. That's one of the main reasons I picked a junior college, because of smaller classes and getting to know the teachers. And they also offer those intro to college classes where they could help me with English."

"My college coach, Jeff Ellis, used to say, 'The first two months, she didn't open her mouth. I didn't know what her voice was like.' It was pretty accurate. You're thrown into it. Nobody speaks Italian. You've got to learn fast. I had to adjust to that very quickly. Even just learning about the school system and how it works with credits and GPA, everything is completely different. I had to learn that quickly and adjust quickly."

THE WORLD STAGE

The pinnacle of Cecchetti's career – to date – came last summer when she marched out with her Italian teammates to take part in the Olympic Games. Team Italy didn't win a game, but they proved they belonged on the world stage.

"It's hard to describe it," Cecchetti said. "It was absolutely amazing. Being in the village, being surrounded by so many great athletes and not just with softball, but any sport in the world, I've dreamed about this since I was a little kid. So finally just getting there and getting that feeling of everything I've worked for so far, now I can say that it's worth it."

The Games were bittersweet for Team Italy, which lost its coach and longtime softball sage Enrico Obletter to complications from COVID-19 in February of 2021.

"It was a really tough journey for us," Cecchetti said. "We lost our head coach to COVID. So that was really tough, and adjusting to the new coaching staff and all of that. We didn't win any games. We got pretty close. We played some good ballgames. But the overall experience for me was great. It's something that I will remember in a positive way for the rest of my life. Looking at it now, that's what allowed me to be here right now."

"(Obletter was) such a big influence. He was the first person to believe in us when we didn't believe in ourselves, when nobody believed in us. His passion, his energy, he just gave all of that to us. He got us to the point where we went from being no one to being a team that is top six teams in the whole world. And that only happened in three or four years. That says it all."

THE ITALIAN DUO

Cecchetti wasn't the only AU player to take part in the Olympics for Team Italy. Catcher Erika Piancastelli, who will begin her third season with AU, was in Tokyo with Cecchetti, and recently played with her in the Japan Diamond League. Piancastelli was asked what fans of AU softball can expect from Cecchetti.

"The fans can expect to see a lot of passion and a lot of smiles from Greta," she said. "She loves the game, and I'm so excited for her to be able to finally experience the AU atmosphere."

Of course, Cecchetti and Piancastelli can make history this season together as the first all-Italian battery in Athletes Unlimited. With teams changing every week, there figures to be several chances for Piancastelli trying to get a hit off Cecchetti, who will be trying to strike out her Team Italy mate.

Either way, it will be a source of pride for both.

"Catching Greta would be so much fun," Piancastelli said. "I definitely love to be able to have the Italian duo in action on the same team. I've caught her so many times but being able to catch her at AU, in front of the AU crowd, against all the elite players there, would be amazing."

"Hitting off Greta would be fun just because I don't get to compete against her much. We're always on the same team and we're both very competitive, so getting a chance to hit off her will be challenging and a lot of fun for me!"



As for Cecchetti, she said she's looking forward to having fun in her venture with AU. She's proud of her role as a pioneer for other Italian softball players. And although she is 33, she warns that she hasn't peaked yet.

"I don't think that point has come yet," she said. "I'm always thinking how lucky I am to get this far but, 'What did I do to get here? How can I stay here? What can I do to do more and be better?' I always have this mentality of, 'I'm 33 years old now, but in my head I'm still that kid from Italy who is trying to do something Italian players have never done before and to push the new generations out of their comfort zones.'

"I didn't even know softball was a thing in Italy, and here we go. We have so many kids playing in junior colleges and so many athletes trying to go to D-I. This is something we didn't have when I started my journey. So it's really exciting for me to see. Now I have people saying, 'This is really cool what you're doing. I want to play, too.' These are opportunities I've never dreamed about when I was younger."



IMPRESSIVE AUX PERFORMANCE EARNS LITTLEJOHN WATKINS SPOT IN SOFTBALL SEASON 3

Out of failure can come great success, or at least another shot at success.

Just ask Sydney Littlejohn Watkins.

A year ago in June, the former University of Alabama standout was in Rosemont, Ill. to take part in open tryouts for Season 2 of Athletes Unlimited Softball.

Things didn't go as planned, and Littlejohn Watkins didn't earn a contract. To add insult to injury, not only did rainstorms force the open tryouts inside to the dome, but then tornado sirens forced players off the indoor field and into shelter during the middle of a scrimmage.

"Oh, my God, that was horrible," Littlejohn Watkins said with a laugh. "Honestly, I'm not going to say that affected me and that was the reason I didn't (perform well at the) tryout because even more than that, I knew I wasn't ready."

Fast-forward to June 2022 and the Athletes Unlimited AUX Softball games in San Diego.

Let's just say that Littlejohn Watkins was ready. In 27 innings pitched, the curveball specialist went 1-0 with a 2.82 ERA and 15 strikeouts. She was all set to try out for Season 3 of AU softball in Rosemont, but her performance in AUX earned her a spot, making another tryout unnecessary.

Making it more special was the way she found out she had made it.

"I texted Cheri (Kempf, AU's Director of Sport, Softball) in a group message and was like, 'Just so you know, I do want to try out again,'" she said. "Luckily, my performance was decent. I thought it was good. It was well enough to be stuck in their minds."

"During the middle of the second series, warming up for a game, we do this thing where we get together and somebody in the group asks a question and everybody in the group answers it. I don't even remember what the question was that day, but at the end, (outfielder) Victoria Hayward was like, 'Hey, guys, we have an announcement. For this person, based on how their performance has been, they've been great, they're great teammates, and Sydney, would you like to join us for Season 3?' I was like, 'Oh!' I cried a little. It was an amazing, full-circle moment. I was really happy, but it was like the little girl inside me was super happy because failing the first time and knowing I wasn't ready, I was OK with that."

BENCH TO CENTER STAGE

With the 27-year-old Littlejohn Watkins, AU will be getting one of the most decorated pitchers in the history of the University of Alabama – with two perfect games to her credit – as well as the quintessential small-town-girl-makes-good story. A native of Rusk, Texas, in the eastern part of the Lone Star State, Littlejohn Watkins didn't take up pitching until she was 12.

"Everybody knows this, so I'm just going to go out and say it: I am very weird and I'm awkward and I embrace every part of that with me," she said. "I had been in cheerleading. I had been doing all these other activities. I'm not going to say I wasn't good at them. In cheerleading, I got to where I was taller than everybody else. It was just awkward."

"A lot of my friends growing up, the friend group I was a part of, played softball. I told my parents, 'I want to play. I want to be social.' I lived out in the boonies. I didn't have a neighborhood that I lived in that I could go play with the kids. I was out jumping hay bales out in the pasture. That was my way of entertainment."

Littlejohn Watkins admits she was not an ace pitcher from the get-go.

"I wanted something to be able to be with my friends and hang out and just have fun," she said. "I fell in love with the game that way, but let me tell you, I was not good. I was the player that happily rode the bench with my little Dr. Pepper and my little wet towel, iced towel around my neck, and I cheered for the team. It was a lot of fun. I would play right field for two innings because that was the rule to get everybody to play at that time."

"And it was fine. I was lanky and awkward and I had big hands and big feet. One of the coaches was like, 'You know what, Sydney? You should try pitching.' I went home and told my parents I wanted to be a pitcher. They laughed at me. They did not take me seriously. God bless 'em. I understand why they did it because it's quite the investment. But then I kept hounding them about it."

There were pitching lessons and three-hour one-way trips on the weekend for those lessons and practices. Littlejohn Watkins' goal at first was to make the varsity high school team. She did that. And then she was good enough for Alabama, where she hit the jackpot, starring in the circle and meeting her future husband, Alex Watkins.

Sydney has an undergrad degree in exercise science and two master's degrees, one in nutrition sciences and one in sports business management.

Today, Sydney and Alex work together at the University of Florida – Alex as a strength and conditioning coach for the Gators football team and Sydney as a registered dietitian.

BACK IN THE CIRCLE

Athletes Unlimited first caught Sydney's attention during Season 1 in 2020.

"It was a lot of things," she said. "First of all, the timing of it. It came out during COVID, and we were all at home sitting and watching. I kept telling my husband, 'Man, I really want to play again.' My body was finally healthy. I had a hip surgery in 2019 so I felt I was finally in a better place from that. And I was also in a place where I graduated with my second master's in December of 2021."

"A lot of these girls are girls that I've played against. Knowing that they're still out there and that they're still competing was definitely what drew me to it. I think it was more of a thing where, 'I got the itch, and I need to scratch it.' So that way, whenever I am older and not able to play anymore, and if my husband and I decide to have kids, I can tell them I gave everything I had. Everything in me tells me that one day I'm going to have daughters. I don't know why. If I have sons, great, but I have a feeling I'm going to have daughters since my sister has boys. I have a feeling I'm going to be the one to have the girls."

"I want to be able to talk the talk and walk the walk like, 'Hey, I did do this. I want you guys to know that I fought for female athletics and female sports and I did my best to make a difference. So that way, you have a better opportunity.' I want to leave my legacy with the game, as well."

AUX Softball was a big boost for Littlejohn Watkins.

"I thought it was great," she said. "It was definitely a grind ... Playing that many games that quickly, I haven't done that in a very long time. But I will say I was very proud of how my body held up. And I was thankful for a lot of the resources that the support staff gave us because that's what kept me together."

"It was such an amazing experience being able to be out there ... A lot of these girls I've played against. But I haven't played with many of them. It was nice to sometimes be on the same team as some of those girls and getting to see how they are as people."

A FRESH PERSPECTIVE

Now with Season 3 of Athletes Unlimited Softball at hand, Sydney Littlejohn Watkins is looking to play again, with a fresh sense of perspective and for the love of the game.

"Personal goals, I want to make a decent showing," she said. "I'm trying to embrace not putting pressure on myself. The thing with these hitters, and I learned it very quickly, is you may have a good outing and you get your confidence up and that's great. But the next game, you could have six runs scored against you so quickly you can't even blink. And the next inning, you're fine."



"My goal with that is to very much have a short-term memory. Being around all these great pitchers, I want to learn – still. Being 27 and pitching, everybody is like, 'What do you mean you want to learn?' But I still want to learn how to set up hitters and how different people do it and perfect some of my pitches as I continue to go through this season. I'm not the same exact pitcher you see every week."

And if there's a folksy analogy to expand on that point, Littlejohn Watkins is there for you with it.

"Obviously, everybody knows with me they're getting a curveball," she said. "I am Raising Cane's Chicken. At Raising Cane's you know you're going to get good chicken. With me, if you're a hitter, you know I'm going to throw you a curveball. I'm not Cheesecake Factory, where you have all these different pitch selections. I am throwing you a curveball. It may be perfecting my drop curves so that way I'm breaking two planes against the batters. Just adding to my arsenal each week is something I would like to do."

In the bigger picture and for the long term, Littlejohn Watkins would like to inspire girls and young women with the lessons of her own story.

"Honestly, as cheesy as it sounds, I say bet on yourself," she said. "Even with me and my story, especially after tryouts last year, everybody was like, 'OK, Sydney, it's time to hang them up. You don't have it anymore.' And I'm like, 'No. I know deep inside me that I still have it.' The only other person that trusted me with that was my husband. Of course I'm very grateful for him. I know what I am capable of, and I know whenever I'm at my limit. And that's OK. Once you know your limits, you're limitless."

"Trusting in yourself and betting on yourself is the best thing you can do ... Whatever happens, good or bad, you got to be happy with yourself for it. You got to 100 percent because even if you fail, you're not leaving any doubt with yourself."



AMANDA CHIDESTER REMINISCES ON CAREER AHEAD OF FINAL SEASON

Amanda Chidester forever will be an Athletes Unlimited history maker.

Two years ago, on the eve of Season 1 of AU softball, Chidester became the first No. 1 draft pick in the organization's history.

Chidester has gone on to become one of the most productive, exciting and vocal players in AU. The power-hitting corner infielder (seven home runs to lead AU in 2021) will serve as the captain of Team Orange for Week 1 of the 2022 season after her second-place finish on last year's leaderboard.

This year will be Chidester's swan song, as she plans to retire as a softball player at season's end after a career that has included starring at the University of Michigan, being a medalist for Team USA in the Olympics and playing professionally.

"I'm getting older," the 32-year-old Chidester said. "I feel I've done everything I wanted to do in the sport. I've started a new venture with HitTrax where I've been working to create an app called RISR, and it's been a lot of fun. It's been taking a lot of my time. It just feels like a great transition, a great time. That drive in me is not quite there, and I want to make sure that I end it with giving the sport everything that I've given in the past and that it has given me. It just seems like it's a fitting moment for me."

A two-time NFCA All-America selection and two-time Big Ten Player of the Year at Michigan, Chidester (known to one and all as "Chiddy") played professionally with the Chicago Bandits and the Scrap Yard Dogs while also playing for Team USA. She and her teammates won a silver medal at the 2020 Olympics, held last year in Tokyo. She also is a five-time medalist in the World Cup of Softball.

When AU came along two years ago, it was a perfect fit for her.

"It's been awesome; it's given more opportunity to play," she said. "Any chance we can play and compete at the highest level is so rewarding, so amazing. It's huge for the sport. It's huge for us. All of us at the professional level just love competing. We've been tossed around here and there, and I feel Athletes Unlimited has been something secure for us the last three years, and that's special. I'm forever grateful for that."

"Everything that Athletes Unlimited represents is really player driven and player focused. It's pretty awesome, and it's going to be huge for women to be able to stay in the game as long as they'd like."

Chidester had no doubts the new venture would take off because of its core principles and how they were put into practice.

"From the beginning, you could tell that everything was done at the highest professional level," she said. "They treated us like professionals right from the start. It was, 'Wow, they're really serious about this and they really want to take this and run with it.' So no, I didn't have doubts because after that first year and how they made it work during COVID. It's like, 'They're serious. They want to do this.' And they really showed that they could, and they continue to do it."

NO. 1

How Chidester became the first overall No. 1 pick is one of those stories that can be summed up in four words: only in Athletes Unlimited. After preseason scrimmages before Season 1, pitcher Haylie Wagner earned enough individual and team points to be named captain of Team Gold, assuring her of the first pick of the weekly draft.

Wagner, a left-handed pitcher, was a teammate of Chidester's for one year at Michigan. She used that first pick to take her onetime college mate. On draft day, Chidester responded playfully when asked if there was any Wolverine bias in the selection.

"I don't know," she said. "You'll have to ask Haylie that question."

Two years later, Wagner said there was much more to the selection than the Michigan sisterhood.

"It's really awesome to have that opportunity and that experience and for her to trust me and for me to trust her and be able to draft those people that you're confident with and you trust on and off the field," she said. "It was Amanda Chidester because I knew I wanted her on my team. I wanted her to make a difference. I wanted her. I trusted her. I knew what she could bring to the table. And I knew she was going to give us that energy that we need on the field."

In fact, Wagner says Chidester made an impression on her when she arrived at Michigan as a freshman and Chidester was a senior. The impact remains to this day.

"I was a very quiet, shy kid my freshman year," Wagner said. "And she was this very bubbly, outgoing person. At first, it was very like, 'Oh, my gosh.' But she has such energy about her that I remember sitting there – and I've told her this; she knows this – my freshman year and we were voting on captains. She ended up being one of our captains. I wrote 'Amanda Chidester' on it. I was like, 'Wow, I want to be her friend one day. Whether we continue on and talk after college or not, I want her to be one of my friends for the rest of my life.' I am lucky enough to have that."

"She is the energetic, loving, happy, amazing personality, competitive person on and off the field. She just drives you to be better. She's only gotten better with that every single year. She helped me go from that quiet, shy freshman player to this confident, outgoing and competitive pitcher on the field."

Fans coming out to the Parkway Bank Sports Complex in Rosemont will be able to hear Chidester above the crowd noise as she encourages and cajoles teammates while enjoying the game of softball. She gladly pleads guilty to being a vocal presence on the field.

"That's definitely me," she said. "It's always been me. I'm passionate about the game. I love playing the game. I love cheering on my teammates. The little kid in me comes out when I get on the field. I love the energy. I just love bringing the energy for my teammates. I feel that's a big role for me. I think that I'm good at it. And I like bringing that to the table every game."

Spectators also should get a kick out of Chidester's walk-up music: "Chitty Chitty Bang Bang." Naturally.

"My nickname is 'Chiddy,' and it was at Michigan where I decided to do that," she said. "The fans loved it. So I was like, 'I'm just going to keep it.'"

ONLY IN AU

As her career winds down, Chidester can walk away knowing that she enjoyed her own "only in Athletes Unlimited" moment last year when she was able to draft her fiancée, Anissa Urtez, with a first-round pick. There were plenty of good softball reasons for that pick. Urtez was the GEICO Defensive Player of the Year, and she batted .327 with one home run and 15 RBI.

"Being able to draft Anissa, we've always played against each other, never really played with each other," Chidester said. "I'm biased. She's the best shortstop. I definitely want her on my team especially when she has that hot bat. It's fun to play together. We always train together. It's nice to bring it to the game, as well."

Although there are games left to play, Chidester says she will stop and take things in as she completes her professional softball career.

"It's a mixture of both," she said of competing and reflecting. "I don't want to put too much pressure on myself to perform, to where it's not enjoyable. So I'm trying to find that balance of enjoying every single moment I have, but obviously as a competitor, I want to be the best. I'm going to find that balance to do both."

"The last four years of my career have been pretty amazing with all of the softball I have been able to play because it's been really challenging. All of the levels have been challenging, and it's constantly making me better. And I love that. So I feel my favorite has been the last four years of my career. It's been the best."



ODICCI ALEXANDER CHANGES JERSEY NAME AND NUMBER FOR LAUREN BERNETT

There is meaning in a name, especially to Odicci Alexander. As a kid, she often wondered why her mom gave her such a unique name but she's learned that what lies in the significance of 'Odicci' has immense value to her.

That's a large part of why changing the name and number on her jersey this Athletes Unlimited season is how she wanted to honor her late teammate and friend Lauren Bennett.

Bennett was a sophomore at James Madison University and starting catcher of the softball team. She died on April 25 and her death was later classified as an apparent suicide by Rockingham County Sheriff's Office. The tragic loss of Bennett, affectionately known as "LB" to her friends and family, rocked everyone who knew her as well as the entire collegiate athletics community.

When Alexander enters the circle in her second season as a pro, she'll be wearing #22 with the last name Bennett.

"I feel like it just means a lot to me because I feel like she's gonna be there with me," Alexander said.

Bennett was Alexander's catcher during their historic 2021 run. They were the ultimate battery, leading the Dukes to a 41-4 record and first ever appearance in the Women's College World Series.

They became quick friends, sparking a connection through the distinct relationship developed in a pitcher-catcher pair. Alexander didn't know who would be her catcher going into her senior season with JMU. It was the freshman.

Both of them bought into one another. Alexander beams as she tells stories of not her best days with Bennett but the rough ones – the practices and bullpens when she didn't know where the ball was going when it released from her hand.

"Lauren would do 360s for me," Alexander laughs.

She always had Alexander's back. Bennett could know Alexander's mood at practice before a word was ever spoken.

"She just knows and she was that person who could always make me laugh in those moments, you know? Some people can't do that... but she knew how to approach me."

During their time together, Alexander can't remember a single day that Bennett didn't make her smile. She recounts thinking that Lauren never had a bad day.

Alexander was competing for Toda Chuo Medics Saitama in the Japan Diamond Softball League when she received the crushing news. She said it was hard being a continent away, feeling like she couldn't be there for her teammates, coaches, and friends who had the same pain crashing down on them. She felt alone.

Journaling has been a longtime habit of Alexanders that helped her throughout the months she was away. Seeing Bennett and #22 on her jersey hanging in her locker is another step in healing.

It's not something she can explain but feels.

"I know she's looking down at me. She's smiling at me and I honestly just wanna make her proud. I mean some games I have where I'm like, oh it's Lauren back there."

Overnight Odicci became a household name in the softball world. But she'll be quick to point out that being a pitcher is not her identity.

When you ask her about the meaning of her name, an odyssey is a journey. As Alexander continues her own she emphasizes that while she plays this game, it is about more than a bat and ball. Her road has brought her to know that "there is more to softball than just playing the sport."

"Everybody's going through something. You always have someone you can talk to. You always have something that you can do."



GANO STEPS INTO BOX WITH DIFFERENT MINDSET FOR SEASON 3

Courtney Gano turned the end of Athletes Unlimited AUX Softball into a grand finale.

That's "grand" as in grand slam. That's "grand" as in a walk-off grand slam in the 10th inning of the season's final game.

Hitting a walk-off homer is the dream of every softball player and baseball player, and it came true for Gano on a June Saturday night in San Diego.

Gano already had hit one home run that night for Team Fischer against Team Zerkle in a game that was tied after seven innings. Both teams scored runs apiece in the eighth and ninth innings, and Team Zerkle forged ahead by a run in the top of the 10th. After Team Fischer scored a run to tie it in the bottom half, Gano ended it with a drive that disappeared into the southern California night for a 10-6 victory.

"It was so fun," she said in Rosemont while getting ready for Season 3 of Athletes Unlimited softball. "The team that I was on was just so fun, my teammates. We were kind of struggling to get a win and to get inning wins. It was really cool, especially because the first two weekends were a little bit of a struggle for me personally at the plate. I was trying to get into a routine. I kept saying, 'Trust the process. Trust the process.' I put the work in. So that game was really fun. I got two home runs. It was like it all paid off. I was just so happy that we could get some inning wins and a win under our belts."

The best part may have been the welcoming committee that greeted her at home plate.

"Oh, I couldn't wait to get in there and celebrate because it was such a long game and we had really, really close games and we just weren't coming out on top," she said. "So it was really, really cool. I think our team camaraderie was just amazing. When you have a really fun team, it makes it that much more special."

Gano is hoping her walk-off heroics provide a grand segue into Season 3 of AU softball in Rosemont, but she's doing so with a well-grounded sense of perspective. The former University of Washington player made her AU debut last year for Season 2. She had hoped to be among the early signees for the inaugural softball season in 2020, but a bigger blessing came along: her son Gregory.

Athletes Unlimited will be a family affair this season, with Gregory and Gano's husband, pro basketball player Abdul Gaddy, joining her in Rosemont.

"I have a different mindset coming in this year," Courtney said. "Last year, I really wanted to prove to myself that I could do it after having a baby. I was really proud to be a mom and come and play. I wanted to take advantage of the opportunity that AU gave us. I kind of came in with not very high expectations. I didn't have much time or the resources to train during the off-season because my husband was overseas during my training time during my off-season. It was maybe five times I got to go hit and bring Gregory with me. It wasn't very much."

"This year we decided that we were going to have somebody help us, and I'll get to go do my training. I trained at a place called Driveline in Washington (State). It's pretty big time in baseball. I was going six days a week. I just got after it. So my expectations and my mindset coming in are a lot different. I'm just really ready to compete, and I'm not doing it just to say I'm here. So I'm feeling a lot better, just physically, mentally and my husband's here, too, so he can help with Gregory. I'm really able to focus now."

Gregory has become quite the star among Gano's teammates, who play the role of doting aunts. Gano calls her son an "epilepsy warrior."

"He has a rare genetic mutation; it's something called pyridoxine-dependent epilepsy, PDE," she said. "It's very rare. At one point we thought one in a million, but I think it's 1 in 600,000. It took a few days to figure out. It was very traumatic, his first few days of life. He was having seizures. He stopped breathing, and I had to give him CPR at three days old."

"There was a lot that went down. We went to Seattle Children's (Hospital), and they are incredible. They helped us so much. They figured out what it was very quickly. He's been stable ever since. He takes medication five times a day. He's on a special diet. This is a lifelong thing that we've planned for. We have the support we need, and he's been thriving. There's things that come with it. There are some developmental delays that can be expected, but we've had all the support we need. He goes to physical therapy. He has his neurologist. We have all those resources, and we're really blessed."

"But it just makes him that much more special. If you meet him ... he's so special."

The love has become a two-way street, with Gregory giving as much as he is getting.

"Last year was really special in that aspect, the support," Gano said. "As the mother of a 1-year-old, I was still getting the hang of things, still breastfeeding, still like, 'I'm just trying to keep my head above water, really.' To be here in this support system was incredible for me because I really needed that. It's hard to be somewhat alone in that first year of motherhood. I really needed it. It was uplifting."

"Now it's cool because he's starting to learn the names of the girls. He knows Abby (Ramirez) and Haylie Wagner. He was saying, 'Abbs, Abbs,' for Abby. He gets to have his second birthday here. Hopefully we have a little celebration for him here with all the girls. It's amazing."

Athletes Unlimited's policies regarding pregnancy and motherhood helped to attract Gano to the league in the first place more than two years ago.

"I was really interested in the concept," she said. "I got a call from (softball player) Gwen Svekis. I think they had four people signed at that point. It was right at the beginning of it. I was planning on being one of the first 10 to sign. That week was when I found out I was pregnant with Gregory. I looked at that as a motivation, at the timing. I was like, 'Man, I wish I could have played,' but there was nothing that was going to trump having Gregory. I was really excited. I got to watch that first season with Gregory in my arms, and I was like, 'You know what? We're going to be out there.'"

"I love the idea of things. I love the investment that they're making for AU. They do it the right way. It's something different. The pregnancy policy is so different because I could never have even thought about having a baby (previously). I would not have been possible. They take care of our child-care. They make it possible."

Gano said she and her husband would love to serve and give back to their sports and communities after their playing days are over. Short term, she will look forward to playing softball without putting pressure on herself but with a renewed sense of self confidence after AUX.

"I think (goals) have changed a little bit since AUX because at AUX, I really came in just expecting to reap the benefits of the work that I put in," she said. "I really am just wanting to enjoy the moment here, be patient with myself and give myself a little bit more grace. I have to understand that the game is very hard. I can't expect to be successful all the time."

"It's more so just enjoying. I'm at my best when I'm enjoying it and embracing my teammates and just living in the moment, at-bat to at-bat, those kinds of things."

That's the same advice she gives to young women and girls coming up in softball.

"We play a very, very hard sport," she said. "And we really need to give ourselves grace. We can't strive for perfection in this sport. Just take it as it is and trust the process of whatever's happening, you've got to just trust it and know that there's a plan. Just keep going."

"There were a lot of times when I thought I was done. I'm just solely talking about the sport right now. I thought I was done a lot of times. I've had four knee surgeries. I just kind of trusted it and kept going. If it's meant to be, it's going to be. There's going to be a lot of opportunities and doors open whether that's softball or outside of softball. Be nice to yourself."



HARRELL FOCUSED ON MAKING MOST OF SEASON 3 OPPORTUNITY

Life is a matter of give and take for Aly Harrell.

On the softball field, Harrell is not afraid to take what the pitcher is giving as evidenced by her gaudy on-base percentage at whatever level she has played. If that means taking a walk, so be it. If that means getting a big hit, even better.

Off the field, Harrell is filled with the spirit of giving. That spirit was rewarded this year when she was named the Senior CLASS Award winner. The CLASS (Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School) Award is presented to an NCAA Division I senior or graduate student who has "notable achievements in four areas of excellence: classroom, community, character and competition."

Harrell is the first player from Marshall University to win the award.

"I was surprised," she said. "Knowing the other girls who were finalists for the award, I was very shocked. I told my coach (Megan Smith Lyon) when she called me, 'No way, I'm shocked, I'm speechless.' She was like, 'I knew it. I'm not shocked at all.' Just having that support of my coach and my teammates, that's very fitting. It was great to see that my peers thought of me that way. To have the NCAA think of me in that light, it's very honorable, and I'm so glad and grateful to have that award."

Harrell shouldn't have been surprised, based on her off-the-field activities and her volunteer work.

Her resume includes volunteering with Little League teams, Veterans Affairs hospitals, Hoops Children's Hospital and being involved with the Marshall Sweetheart Clinic. That spirit, she says, has been with her all of her life.

"I think I've kind of always had it," said the native of Gahanna, Ohio, outside of Columbus. "When I was young, my best friend and I would play like girls do, but we'd play things that would help people. We always went and looked for wild animals. I fostered a baby bird that fell out of the nest at one point. I was in Girl Scouts since I was in kindergarten. I still am a lifetime Girl Scout. That's one I'd like to continue to give back to. I love it. It brings a joy to see that I'm making someone else's day ... I think that's important, that everyone else can feel that type of love and passion in something. So I want to give that back."

Harrell joined AU for AUX Softball in June after a prolific career at Marshall, where she was a five-year letter winner, compiling a .390 career batting average with 53 home runs and 220 RBI. She owns Thundering Herd records with 175 walks and a .562 on-base percentage.

She is the second player from Marshall in AU, joining outfielder Morgan Zerkle, one of the captains for Week 1 of AU Softball in Rosemont.

"I think just making a name at Marshall University, showing that there is talent in other schools other than just Power 5s bringing recognition to the school and growing the program there," Harrell said.

As for her uncanny ability to get on base, she said it's been with her for as long as she can remember.

"I went to hitting lessons a lot as a child," she said. "A big thing as a lefty power hitter is the outside pitch. We drilled, drilled, drilled the outside pitch and being able to get to those pitches and also drilled being able to recognize what a ball was. I think something that helped me was being able to know that I can hit the ball but at the same time, I know it's a ball when I'm swinging. As I grew up with my dad as my coach, he was always like, 'Any way you can get on is a way to help our team win.' I took that to heart. If that's a base hit, if that's getting walked, getting hit (by a pitch), I just embraced it the older I got."

That approach didn't stop at Marshall.

"When I got to college, our coaches were a lot more like, 'We want people on base, we want to be able to score runs,'" she said. "With the eye I had, that's something I bought into, being able to be a threat hitting wise and a threat with the fact that, 'I'll be on base.'"

"I grew more into it and bought into it more. So now it's something I embrace, and I love the fear (from the other team) of, 'Oh, crap, we're going to walk her.' If they don't want to walk me, they're going to give me something to hit. But if they do want to walk me, I have confidence in my teammates behind me that they can hit me in. I've been blessed to have teams and teammates that could protect me in that kind of way, where I am on base and I can score at the same time."

It helps that AU's points-scoring system rewards all skill sets, whether it be power hitting, speed or the ability to coax walks and get on base.

"Yes, I love that aspect where every little thing is accounted for and every little thing is cherished," Harrell said. "I think that's really big because stealing bases is important, getting people in scoring position. It's kind of more inclusive that way. It allows for the fast triple threats like Morgan (Zerkle) to be able to succeed. It allows the power hitters as well. On top of that, it allows pitchers to succeed because they're getting points for every out. I think it's really cool they were able to design it in a way that everyone can thrive and that it can be anyone's ballgame for a winner at the end of it."

Like all the players in Athletes Unlimited, Harrell is playing for a cause. Hers is Play Like a Girl, an organization "on a mission to level the playing field by leveraging the skills girls gain from sport to propel young women into competitive, male-dominated careers in STEM+ (science, technology, engineering, math)."

"I picked it because I am a woman in STEM, and I eventually want to be a doctor after I'm done playing," she said. "Growing up, there weren't many female doctors. Now there are a lot more, and there's a lot more females in STEM jobs, and I think that's great ... I loved when (AU) sent me the causes list. That was one of the first ones I opened. I was like, 'Yes.' It had what I wanted. It wants to empower girls to play sports and find love in sports and be able to carry that into becoming a STEM major and going into a STEM field."

During any Athletes Unlimited Game, you can find Harrell cheering on and encouraging her teammates when she is not in the game. It's something she hopes young women and girls see and take with them.

"I just worked the Mizuno camp. That was the big thing I emphasized to them: energy goes so noticed. We notice the little things you do – your little frowns, your little smiles, how you interact with others. Those are big things. That just shows your passion for the game. That's a big thing for me, my energy and my passion, and I love cheers. That's how I show my passion for the game. Just being a good teammate."

"Something I'm working on now is not looking to the future too much, kind of living in the moment and loving the moment now ... I'm here, and I'm taking every day one at a time. I'm grateful for each moment and taking it in. It's just a breath of fresh air each day. I love that and just being grateful for where you are, where your feet are and being where your feet are. That would be one thing I would love to tell young girls: be where your feet are."



Q&A: KIKI STOKES-O'CONNOR STEPPING THROUGH THE NEXT OPEN DOOR IN SOFTBALL

In 2016, Kiki Stokes was drafted sixth overall in the National Pro Fastpitch College Draft by the Scrap Yard Dawgs, the highest draft pick in Nebraska softball history. Since then, a lot has changed.

Her jersey says Stokes-O'Connor now (she got married in June), she moved back home to Kansas City, Missouri (she's the new head coach of the University of Missouri-Kansas City Softball), and she's an Athletes Unlimited Softball athlete.

In just a month, all three of these life changes occurred, but she wouldn't have it any other way.

As she embarks on a new chapter in her career in softball, she'll close out her journey as a player. The 2022 Athletes Unlimited Softball season will be Stokes-O'Connor's last as a pro as she commits to investing in and building the Kansas City Softball program. We spoke to Stokes-O'Connor about the dreams she's accomplished throughout her life and the ones yet to come.

Savanna Collins: The last time you competed was with This Is Us and then Alliance to help prepare Team USA for the Olympics over a year ago. As you were coaching, did you still have that itch saying you weren't done quite yet?

Kiki Stokes-O'Connor: A lot of people were kind of shocked after finding out that I was playing AU because I was kind of non-existent for a year. After the whole This Is Us thing, I feel like I didn't really get to end on my terms. Softball's been such a big part of my life, especially being a professional. I've taken a lot of pride in being able to have that opportunity because not everybody gets it. I think I've just had a sour taste in my mouth and I was like, "I wanna finish on my terms and be able to go out in a really good way."

With how much good stuff I had heard about [Athletes Unlimited] and the people, I knew it's gonna be a really good place for me to be able to end my career on a high note and be able to have fun with it as well.

SC: So you expect this will be your last season playing?

KSO: This is probably gonna end up being my last season only because coaching is something that I've become very, very passionate about. It's hard, especially being at the Division I level and being a head coach. There are a lot of things, whether it's the recruiting aspect or making sure your kids are taken care of. I'll be able to hang it up because I'm still close to the game. But I also wanna start a family. I'm closing one door and taking the next door that's open a little bit more seriously.

SC: You're closing this chapter on 'Kiki Stokes: the athlete,' and continuing as a coach. Looking back on you as the player, what do you hope your legacy is?

KSO: I hope the legacy that I left with Kiki as a player is that she gave everything. She loved hard love whether that was the people, whether that was the game in itself. And truly just enjoyed being in moments that maybe everybody didn't get to experience. And on top of that, I guess just being the player that was not only a really good teammate but just a good person. And people could say that she was always a good person.

SC: Thinking about that next door, when you started out as an assistant at South Dakota State and then moved into a head coach position at Upper Iowa, what is it about this aspect of the game that really pulls you in?

KSO: I knew I wanted to be a head coach going into South Dakota State; I just didn't know when it was going to be. Being able to build relationships with players is by far my favorite part of the game. Being a player's coach and being able to connect with them on a different level is something that I'm very passionate about.

I also see that these kids need something a little bit different. The way that I was coached, it's a lot different from what these kids need now. I want to be the game changer for them and help them find their way through life. A lot of times people think coaching is so black and white: you've gotta be able to teach them how to hit a ball and field the ball, but there's so much more to that. And if you can get that 'more' they'll go above and beyond for you.

There are a lot of kids that aren't having fun with the game anymore, and it's kind of sad, but that's the part that I'm like, 'I can bring that back. I can bring that fun piece back.' That is the part that like makes kids want to love softball and want to play.

SC: That's so exciting... You can take the positives of your experiences to replicate and the things that you look back on and wish were different you can change for this next group of athletes.

KSO: Right, exactly. Because I think for me, softball was always an outlet. It was never something that I was like hitting a ball and catching a ball – I was passionate about that – but it went beyond. It was what my coaches did for me and how they impacted my life and what my friendships meant to me. Those were the things that I think that I remember a little bit more than the actual physical aspect of the game. And so to give that to somebody else, I think is why I really love coaching.

SC: Your journey as a coach took you to SDSU as an assistant for three years then a successful head coaching experience at Upper Iowa University. What makes this next experience so special?

KSO: I haven't been home since high school so being able to be in Kansas City with my family, with my friends, I think it's something that I never would've ever imagined. I didn't think that I would be a head coach for a year and then get a job opportunity like this at a D-I school and a great conference. On top of that, my husband gets the job at the same place as well, he's a strength coach. Us coaching under the same roof, it's just rare. You don't ever really see that. Both of us are literally living a dream. It's such a blessing and we're so grateful for it. It's so cool to see how everything can change in a span of a month.

SC: As you look back on your dreams that you realized, what is the next dream? Are you in it right now?

KSO: I was telling my husband this the other night I used to journal a lot. Before I got to South Dakota State, there were probably eight different schools that I had applied to and got denied. And I was like, 'Dang...I really want to coach, but when is that opportunity gonna come for me?' And it came first at SDSU with Krista Wood and it was the best experience that I had ever had in my life. And I said, 'This is exactly where I'm supposed to be.'

I'd never imagine myself being at a D-II school but that was something in my journey that I needed to be where I am today. Sometimes you don't really know what path you're going to go on, but you take opportunities, you build, you learn, and you grow from those.

My biggest dream is to be back at Nebraska which is my alma mater. That's the place where I fell in love with softball to a whole other end. I had coaches there that completely formed me as a person. And so for me, that's the goal. That's the dream.

I've always had big dreams and goals of being a coach at the Power Five level. I thought I wasn't gonna be a head coach until I was in my thirties with kids. And here we are 28, no kids. I'm living a dream.

Writing things down and watching things manifest is something that I've learned and that I've gotten a little bit more used to. It's good and bad: when you look back at things that you wrote down and then you achieve 'em, it's this feeling of, 'Dang, I really put my mind to something and I accomplished it.' On the negative side, when you have big dreams and goals it's super important not to get discouraged when things aren't happening at your pace because they very well could happen.



MORGAN ZERKLE AIMS TO BREAK INTO TOP 4 IN THIRD CHAMPIONSHIP SEASON

From A to Z. It's a catch phrase that denotes completeness or totality.

For Athletes Unlimited softball, we can expand that phrase to "from A to Zerkle."

Meet outfielder Morgan Zerkle.

Now in her third championship season in Rosemont, Ill., Zerkle has become the embodiment of the complete and consistent player, one who has grown into a multifaceted force on the field, one who can score offensive points in every way possible.

Two years ago, this product of Marshall University introduced herself to AU and quickly made a name for herself with her on-base ability and speed on the basepaths.

Then in 2021, along came the power. After not hitting a home run in Season 1, Zerkle homered in the first game of Season 2 on her way to hitting four for the season to go along with a .300 batting average and six stolen bases in six attempts. Those totals enabled her to finish sixth on the individual leaderboard for two seasons in a row.

That upward growth curve continued this summer during AUX Softball in San Diego, where Zerkle batted .385 with a .467 on-base percentage and a home run to finish fourth on the board.

The arrow continues to point up as Season 3 in Rosemont is in full swing.

"I've had a really good start to the season," she said. "I think that playing in AUX really helped because it was kind of like a spring training. I also got to be a captain there as well, so it kind of prepared me for the first week here. I'm just seeing it well. Very familiar, obviously, with the third season being here (in Rosemont). It's been a good start.

"The last three years, I think, it's really grown because of the environment here. It is very individual, but it's also very team based. It's cool to see how if you perform, you get a shot. I've been able to perform and get a shot because there are no coaches involved. It's who's doing well. From my first season, where I slapped a lot, to my season last year where I hit several home runs and this year kind of having a mix of both worlds, but just being really comfortable. And this environment has been fun for me to grow and be more comfortable throughout. It's fun."

What's more, Zerkle found herself one of the four team captains to begin this season in Rosemont.

"It was fun because I joke that I've always been the 'first loser,'" she said. "I hadn't medaled or been a captain. So it was fun to be in that leadership role and combine my abilities as a coach with being a player."

Born and raised in Milton, West Virginia, Zerkle stayed in-state for college and became one of the most productive players in Marshall history. She finished her collegiate career atop Marshall's record books in batting average (.451), triples (14) and stolen bases (162) while ranking second in slugging percentage (.594), on-base percentage (.489), runs (181), hits (289) and total bases (381).

In AU, with so many players from Power 5 conferences, Zerkle takes immense pride in repping a mid-major college program. She is joined this season by fellow Marshall alum Aly Harrell.

"That's something I take a whole, whole, whole lot of pride in, just that you can do that," she said. "You don't have to play at a Power 5 to be able to compete at a high level. This is my sixth year now out of college playing pro so it's a lot easier now than it was right out. Your confidence isn't always as high when you are a mid-major athlete right out, trying to get your footing in the pro world. But I've stuck to my own every year.

"I feel like I'm finally at a place where I'm not the mid-major kid anymore that really has to prove themselves over and over again, proving myself. So it's nice to relax and be able to say, 'Yeah, look what I have done.'"

Zerkle's numbers in college suggested she would hit for power as a pro. That came to the fore last season. It also doesn't hurt that AU's individual points-scoring system places a premium on hitting home runs.

"Just being confident in using it more," she said of her power stroke. "Being as fast as I am, slapping is kind of easy. It's an easy choice to have, to make sure I make contact. But here, with the points system, you get 40 points if you hit a home run, so it's kind of encouraged me to swing more because I'm capable and I have the power so why not go for 40 points versus going for 10 points? It's definitely encouraged me to be more powerful and use that skill set."

Of course, with singles, doubles, triples and stolen bases being rewarded, Zerkle had no problem piling up points during her first two seasons, even without hitting a home run.

"I think it shows the value of every person and their skill set and what they can bring to a team, having that table-setter type of hitter, having the home run kind of hitter," she said. "The game shows how valuable it is to have a catcher who can call a good game. I think that's something that gets overlooked. I think in AU, you can see a lot of those skill sets shine when it's so player led in every little thing and in every little moment and pitch matters."

Zerkle is hoping her career-long consistency pays off in another climb up the leaderboard this summer.

"I want to stay consistent again, maybe not be the first loser, but maybe win it," she said of the top spot on the board. "That's always the goal, to win it. I think people are afraid to say it, but of course I want to win. Who doesn't? But most of all, be consistent and be a little more of a leader this year because I am six years into playing and have that experience here at AU. So being able to mentor people like Aly Harrell to make my mark on the league as well."

Still young (27 on Aug. 12), Zerkle has plenty of softball left in her. This season she is playing for the Natasha Watley Foundation, which "provide(s) programs for girls in historically marginalized communities to expose them to the beautiful game of softball."

Her spirit of mentoring has led her into coaching. For the past several years, she has been an assistant coach at Miami University in Oxford, Ohio.

"I love coaching, and I think I'm going to do it as long as I can, forever probably," she said. "I've gotten several offers for different jobs this year, but I'm very passionate about coaching those mid-major kids. I think that's hard for some people to understand, but that's what I'm most passionate about. I don't know if I'll move up in coaching, but I love coaching, and that's definitely what I'm going to do forever.

"Playing wise, I think I'm just now getting to the top of, or even close to, my peak of where I could be. I think I was not as developed, even out of college, as some of the other players, so as long as I'm still improving, getting better and healthy, I'm going to keep playing. I have no intention of stopping any time soon."



FILLER CONNECTS WITH ITALIAN ANCESTRY THROUGH SOFTBALL JOURNEY

The road to Athletes Unlimited Softball for Andrea Filler has taken her around the world, gotten her in touch with her ancestral roots and been culturally enriching.

This summer, it landed her right at home in Evanston, Illinois, just a long flyball from Parkway Bank Sports Complex in Rosemont.

The 29-year-old Filler finally got her first chance to play for AU in June, when she finished an impressive seventh on the leaderboard in San Diego. She got off to a strong start in the Championship season in Rosemont, where she has fit right in with players she has competed with and against for years, whether it be in college, the professional ranks or as a member of Team Italy in last year's Olympic Games.

"It's been a really fun time, just to have the opportunity to play with all of the players who are in the league who I have played against my entire career," she said. "I think my favorite part about it is getting to know people personally. You get to know them as a competitor, so you start to formulate, 'Oh, they must be like this or like that, their personality must be a certain way based on the way they compete on the field.'

"Then you meet them off the field, and it's like, 'Wow, it's really great to know them,' and learn about their past and their path to softball. Everybody has a unique journey. So it's been really fun."

Athletes Unlimited is the current way station for Filler, a native of Fort Wayne, Indiana. After she played two years of college softball at Boston College, she transferred to Northwestern, also in Evanston, where she obtained her bachelor's degree in communications and her master's in sports administration before earning a School of Professional Studies certificate in leadership and marketing. She worked as director of operations for Northwestern's softball and field hockey programs from 2018-21.

Filler played professionally for the Chicago Bandits of National Pro Fastpitch and as a pro in Italy while trying to obtain Italian citizenship (through her maternal great grandmother) so she could become eligible for the Italian national team.

Along the way, she was able to enjoy, soak up and taste the culture of Italy.

"I grew up in a very traditional Italian home, so we have a lot of the same customs that you see in Italy," she said. "That was really fun and comforting for me, a lot of the stuff that I was used to in my home, like sitting down as a family for a meal and staying at the table from dinner through dessert through coffee.

"Just to learn more personally about the culture of Italy. It's completely different than our lifestyle. There's no one right or wrong way to live. I think it makes you appreciate their lifestyle. Over there it's not so work centric. It gives me good perspective. It gave me really good perspective of work is work, invest your time in your people. That's one thing I always carry with me from my time over there."

It took some legal wrangling for Filler to obtain Italian citizenship. She had to win a court case that challenged Italian law saying citizenship could only be passed down on the male side of a family. Having succeeded in that, Filler was able to represent Italy in the Olympics.

"It was an extremely unique experience," she said. "I've played a lot of softball games, a lot of tournaments ... But I think that setting in itself was so unique. You're playing at the highest level, and you're representing something that's more than yourself, as well. You're representing for your country and for your heritage, and I think that gives you more meaning behind the games you're playing, every pitch that you're playing. And for the sport, as well, to be playing softball when the sport was taken out of the Games for 12 years, 13 years. It meant a lot to be that person in that position to be playing on that stage, representing our sport at that level."

While playing for Team Italy, Filler was teammates with Erika Piancastelli and Greta Cecchetti, both of whom play for AU.

"It's so great," she said. "I think the one hard part about playing overseas when you live here permanently and are from here is you build great friendships with your teammates and for me personally, I live there for three or four months at a time, and then I come back home. It's hard when you're not with each other all the time. You kind of get ripped from that setting, and you have to try to stay connected somehow.

"It's just really cool that they're both here now. The three of us have shared so much, the good and the bad through this journey together. So it's really cool to be playing here together but also doing it together and representing Italy softball here on this stage and showing everybody from Europe and from Italy that this is something that's attainable, too, to play on this stage. It's always great to do it with teammates you've gone to battle with before."

With her love for softball as alive as ever after the Olympics, Filler kept AU in her sights. After some persistent knocking at the door, it finally opened.

"The past two years, I was a replacement player, but I was pursuing making the Italian national team final roster," she said. "Some of the requirements to be on the Italian national team was to play in the pro league in Italy. That was my main focus. I was a replacement player, so if somebody got COVID or somebody got hurt, they would maybe call me in. But I was overseas, so it was a little difficult to make my way over here if I did get the call. It didn't end up happening.

"Every year I reached out to whoever was on the PEC (Player Executive Committee) that year and let them know that I was interested in playing. I did the same thing after I finished the season in Italy, which ended in October. I took a little bit of a break and then reached out to PEC members and told them that I would be interested in playing in the league, to consider me. They contacted me right around May and asked me if I'd be interested in playing. I was like, 'Absolutely.'"

Even with a seventh-place finish in AUX, Filler was not setting specific goals for Championship season.

"Honestly, I didn't come in with any expectations of, 'I've got to finish in top five,' or anything like that," she said. "I wanted to get comfortable on the field as quickly as possible. In any new setting, especially in a really competitive setting, it's kind of hard to settle in and feel yourself right away. My No. 1 goal was I want to come in and get comfortable, get my feet underneath me. At AUX, I ended up finishing seventh, and that was great. I was very happy with that. But the competitor in me was like, 'I know I can do better.'

"For this one (Championship season), I want to compete every at-bat. I want to win every pitch. I like to keep my mindset more on the things I can control and the things that I can keep within myself. So just being competitive with every pitch, every at-bat, playing hard every time.

"And lastly, being a great teammate and showing people who I am as a person and letting people get to know me, being open, vulnerable and forming some great relationships. I think at the end of the day we're all out here trying to do the same thing, which is to grow our sport and to put the best product on the field every day. I think one thing that's really fun about AU is we play with different teams every week. We get to know different people every week. I've really enjoyed that experience of getting to know different people and growing relationships that way."

The journey is far from over for Filler, who won't be 30 until February. Amid all of the travel and all of the softball over the past few years, she has made sure to take the time to reflect on all of the places she has been and all of the faces she has seen.

"Especially after the Olympics, you kind of settle down back at home and you start to think about, 'Wow, what did I just do?'," she said. "The Olympics was such a fast time because when we got there, we spent some time practicing in Japan and we had the week of the games and then we had to leave right away. So it was like a whirlwind time. It was really fast.



"Once I got home, I kind of settled down. I was like, 'Wow, I can't believe, No. 1, that I just played in the Olympics and was in Japan playing at the highest level of the game.' Then you start to think back about your career. I started playing in a Little League and I didn't know where softball would take me. I was just playing, and it was fun. I've gone through all these different stages and played at different levels.

"You sit down and think, 'What more is there? What more could there be?' And this (Athletes Unlimited) kind of falls in your lap and you're like, 'OK, this is incredible,' just continuing to play the game at the highest level. It's an honor for me to be able to do that, but I think the coolest part for me is how it's brought my family together and for me, playing on the national team, it made me feel really connected to my extended family members in Italy, especially my great grandmother, who I didn't get a chance to meet. I just felt really connected to her ... The fact that I got my citizenship through her was a really cool thing for me. I'm really connected to her through that."



AUBREY LEACH BALANCES PRO SOFTBALL WITH ASPIRATIONS OF LAW DEGREE

To watch Aubrey Leach on the softball field is to watch a player who looks like she's making up for time missed.

There's a kinetic urgency to Leach's game, whether she's spraying and slapping hits all over the field, running the bases with abandon or flashing leather at second base.

Leach is back with Athletes Unlimited after missing the 2021 season. But let's not mistake time missed for time wasted, because Leach was in noble pursuit. After playing in the 2020 season and finishing 17th on the individual leaderboard, Leach stepped away from AU last year to study law at the University of Tennessee, where she starred on the softball diamond for the Volunteers.

The door was left open for Leach's return this season, and she burst through. Entering the final weekend of the Championship season, Leach ranks 17th on the leaderboard, up three spots from last weekend. She is 13-for-35 (.371) at the plate with a .450 on-base percentage. More importantly, she's relishing her time back on the field.

"I'm so glad to be back," she said. "It was a really strange break. I loved supporting, but I was also kind of jealous to see everyone playing and I was in law school. The season (last year) being in the fall conflicted with the fall semester, so I just wasn't able to be here last season. But now that they've moved it more into the summer, I'm here and I'm hoping they keep it that way and I can be back next year, too."

"It was so tough to watch because I wanted to be out there. Being on the GA/coaching side, it's kind of hard to sit on that side of the fence. And then to see all my professional peers playing, too, it was itching me to be back on the field. They said I was always welcome. They've given me everything I could have asked for in support for my decision to go to law school. It was really nice to be welcomed back. As soon as I saw the schedule change, I shot them an email, and they were like, 'Yes, please come.'"

The fall session of law school for Leach has begun, but she is able to Zoom classes before she has to head back to school in person. She has become an expert at balancing all she has going on in life.

"It's been a lot," she said. "I was really excited the first four weeks here; I didn't have any school. It was freedom, just being able to play and get out there and grind when I needed to grind and not have any worries that I was spending too much time at one place or the other, so it was nice."

Being a longtime student-athlete has helped Leach budget her time and juggle softball and law school.

"Definitely," she said. "Being able to work together, being able to communicate. Time management is huge. I think I was at a great advantage already being a student-athlete having to study and play at the same time. And now, I think it's helped me so much. I don't have that learning curve that a lot of people do just with the demand of law school."

STEEPED IN HISTORY

Aubrey Leach is carrying on quite the heritage in diamond sports. She was coached extensively by her dad, Todd, whose own father, Lynn, played fastpitch softball. Todd's mother, Wilma Ann Williams-Leach, was a member of the Rockford Peaches of the All-American Girls Professional Baseball League, immortalized in the movie, "A League of their Own."

On a wall in the concourse of the Parkway Bank Sports Complex in Rosemont is a tribute to Williams-Leach. Included is a quote from her, which reads: "Those are the same stars, and that is the same moon, that look down upon your brothers and sisters, and which they see as they look up to them, though they are ever so far away from us, and each other."

The display also includes photos of Leach and her grandmother, with a touching inscription from Aubrey: "Wilma Ann Williams-Leach was at the forefront of competitive women's sports. She blazed a trail, excelling at multiple sports, and making a name for herself as a true athlete. As my Grandmother she has always been an influence on our family and a driving force behind our love for Softball. Without women like Wilma Ann Williams-Leach, I would not have the opportunity to compete today. We stand on her shoulders."

Leach did not get to meet her grandmother, her inspiration resonates.

"Huge," she said. "And I don't think I always knew it. She has definitely trickled down through our family. My dad's side is very athletic, but he always instilled her trailblazing nature of, 'Just go do it. If you're passionate about it and you think this is your right direction, just go do it.' That was kind of her m.o. She loved sports. She played volleyball in high school, but as soon as the (baseball) tryout (came), she grabbed her brother and went. That's something that I've been able to take and just go, go do it. And then the passion. I think we all have her softball in our family. That comes from her."

Leach says she has not yet watched the new series of the same name on Amazon Prime, but she has heard about her grandmother's reaction to the movie, "A League of their Own."

"I have always been told that she used to joke that the part in the movie where they sneak out and go dancing, and she's like, 'Oh we never did that.' She had to have appreciated how much detail they did in the movie," she said.

CARVING OUT HER OWN LEGACY

With a refreshed spirit, Aubrey Leach is enjoying life at Athletes Unlimited and its player-driven environment.

"I feel like a true professional here," she said. "They treat us with such respect. They give us so much freedom, but I think that's also what comes with the territory of being a professional – you're on your own, you're training on your own, you've got to know what you need and then to add in the coaching aspect from the four captains each week. I think that's a huge step in the right direction for softball."

Unlike two years ago, when the onset of COVID-19 kept fans away from the ballpark, this season has been a revelation for Leach, who gets to ply her trade in front of enthusiastic spectators.

"It's been great, not only to see people inspired by us, but also to be inspired by them, coming out and their dedication to the sport," she said. "I've had people from Tennessee here. It's just wild to see how well softball travels and how important our game is to people."

The future may hold a career in contract law for Leach so she can remain in sports – she has been shadowing sports-agent contract lawyers – but whatever that future holds, softball will be a part of it.

"I'm not ready to give it up," she said. "The first season of not playing college ball and having to sit and wait for the pro season, I was dying because I had always been used to softball all year round. So it's definitely been a big change. I want as much of it as I can get."

"Softball has taken me so many places I would have never gone. It's earned me not only an undergrad education but now a law degree. I couldn't have even seen that as a possibility when I was that 10-year-old picking up a softball."



ANNA LAIBLE: A TEENAGE REPORTER'S AU SOFTBALL EXPERIENCE

Covering Athletes Unlimited Softball in Rosemont, Ill. this weekend was a dream come true. Having the opportunity to connect with and learn from some of the best players in the world is incomparable. This was the first women's professional sports venue I had the opportunity to experience live and in person.

But experiencing AU for myself as a writer was something so unique and special that I hadn't been a part of before. AU has a unique scoring system that highlights the importance of every play. It is not only team driven, but also individually driven with points awarded based on offensive plays (single, double, triple, home run, stolen base, caught stealing, walk, hit by pitch, and sacrifice fly/bunts), pitching points (earned runs and outs), MVP points (voted on by the players at the end of every game), and team/inning wins.

The AU hashtag #BeUnlimited truly sums up the vision that its founder Jon Patricof had – to see racial, gender, and income equality across professional sporting events. To see fans come out to support 60 of the top female athletes in the world is incredible. The number of fans will only grow as the level of competition continues to rise at AU and the fan base expands in more sites across the country.

Janae Jefferson, four-time All-American at Texas, talked about what the transition from college to pro was like for her.

"It is a big jump just being out here with all of these professional athletes. Everybody is good out here, and I feel like that was the biggest jump I had was just realizing that everyone is amazing, pitching is better, and the speed of the game is different," Jefferson said.

One of the highlights of my experience was meeting so many new faces. I had the chance to shadow Savanna Collins and Ci Michel (a former Great Britain volleyball Olympian), two leaders on the media side, and see their perspectives from the dugout, field, stands, and concourse. I spoke with Danielle Lawrie, a Canadian softball Olympian from Tokyo 2021, who has been a guest on my Speak Up Sports podcast, after she called one of the games. Collins took me to the dugout, a view I had never experienced before while reporting. Michel interviewed me; I'm rarely on the side of receiving questions! After every game, I had the chance to meet, interview, and talk with all of these incredible athletes.

Some of my favorite interviews from the weekend were with outfielder Aliyah Andrews, catcher Savannah Jaquish, and infielders Sis Bates and Sierra Romero. I loved learning strategy from them and talking to the game's best athletes, especially when they were as down to earth as they were. Whether they were in the dugout, signing autographs after every game, or talking with the crowd in the on-deck circle, these ladies were engaging, encouraging, and passionate.

When speaking with the AU players, who represented four of the six countries from the last Olympics (USA, Canada, Italy, and Mexico) about what they like most about Athletes Unlimited, their reasons were very similar to mine. They all loved the people at AU. The player-first environment focuses not only on the athlete but also on the person as a whole which offers a unique facet of AU.

"My favorite part of it is the people, the environment, and the staff. Every single person here is so amazing. They make me feel like a true pro and I'm just so grateful for the environment they provide us with because these girls are awesome," Romero said.

During this five-week season, all of the players practice at an indoor turf facility covered by a dome during the week and warm up there before their games. The dome is where the weekly Monday drafts are held, where the athletes' locker rooms are, and where they can take batting practice. It was fun getting to see the home of where these professional players spend most of their time during their summer season.

All in all, my first weekend at AU Softball was filled with so many amazing memories. The games were filled with lots of scoring, stellar plays, and more! I love the fact that every play and every inning can impact the leaderboard standings. I can't wait to see who will come out on top at the end of the season!



BUBBA NICKLES AND THE BOLDNESS OF ASKING QUESTIONS

On paper, Bubba Nickles' production and performance as a softball player look similar to the success that is a recurrent part of her journey.

As a late-comer last year, she took the first pitch she saw as an Athletes Unlimited player for long. She's a medal-winning member of Team USA and an NFCA All-American at UCLA.

But if you ask her, she's different. At practice, in the dugout. She's been working on an aspect of her game that isn't a drill or reps taken in the cage. Nickles has been developing the courage to ask questions, and it's made all the difference for her.

When she arrived at AU last season, she was late to the party. She flew in ahead of Week 3 as a replacement player and recalls the experience feeling daunting. She tried to quickly acclimate to the schedule, changing teams, and pace of the league.

"I feel like learning to ride the waves is what makes it a good process," Nickles said. "It's not easy, but it does benefit all of us."

Before arriving in Rosemont, she played for the Toyota Red Terriers of the Japan Diamond League in 2022. Her prep for this season consisted of one key thing: rest.

"My preparation was rest and not even touching a softball because I feel like distance makes the heart grow fonder," Nickles explained. "It allowed me to come in here a lot more excited and embrace it more."

Nickles was determined to be less of what she describes as "standoffish" compared to last year and not let intimidation keep her from making more connections. Being drafted to Team Chidester in Week 1 really helped with that.

She's played with Amanda Chidester on Team USA and leaned into the welcoming environment Chidester creates on her teams with her fiancée Anissa Urtez.

"Together, they open up this dynamic where they want to grow others around them," Nickles explained. "It's really cool because it's like two is better than one. Them being on the same team really opens up... They feel like they're getting their cup poured into even more because both of them are willing to help so many people."

This dynamic set Nickles on the journey of asking questions.

Can you help me with this at bat? What pitches are you seeing? What do you think is best?

She started to go to Urtez and Chidester, as well as other veterans in the league like Hannah Flippin, to help her step into the box with more intention.

"Sometimes I'm brutally like, 'Straight up, what should I swing at?' Having the boldness of approaching someone with: I need help. Can you help me with this at bat?"

The veterans have helped give her confidence through their answers. Not only have they told her what they think she should take a swing at, but they've helped Nickles understand her strengths and how to take advantage of them at the plate.

"They believe in me enough to just give me a pitch and they know, 'I told her to hit it and I know she will hit it.' So that's your plan."

It's not always easy to work up the courage to ask. Nickles knows that in the moments you're experiencing the high and lows of a game the time might not feel right. "I know that when I strike out, I don't wanna talk about it."

But what she's learned through the camaraderie that AU fosters is that's what a lineup is about: all nine players trying to help the next one get on base, regardless of individual outcomes.

It's how they win innings and games and ultimately, climb the leaderboard.

"I wanna be mentored by them. It does take a lot of courage and boldness, but it really is fulfilling when you [know] they believe in me because they gave me an answer," Nickles laughed.

When she self-reflects on who she is as a professional in her second season, it's a contrast to who she was in college.

"I was just constantly wanting to swing a bat 500 times, throw a ball 500 times, get as many reps and, if possible, do it alone," Nickles recalls. "And then in a game, be absolutely silent."

Now she does much less in practice, focusing on quality time. She explains that she does not go to practice to work for an outcome.

"I'm gonna come here practicing out of gratitude for being here and live into the blessing that all of this is."

Nickles gave the example of hitting well over the course of a weekend and then not feeling inclined to put in more time. Then if you struggle, overcompensating with dozens of reps.

"Where's the consistency of that?" she asked.

Back in Week 1, Nickles went 2-for-3 with a double, home run, and four RBIs. In her postgame interview, she talked about being herself, trusting God, and trusting the process. She expanded on exactly what that means to her. It answers her previous question about consistency.

"Trusting the process is just not changing what I do depending on an outcome," she explained. "It's having a consistent everyday. I'm meant to be here. So I'm gonna live into that."

There's less weight to succeed when she steps on the field now which in a way is ironic, considering the season she is having. Nickles is hitting over .300 with a slugging percentage of .571 and a walk-off hit in her record book.

Regardless of the results, she's more fulfilled.

"I think that's what softball does, it's a mirror. It's reflecting what you're good at and what you're weak at and where you can improve and where you can actually help others. Everything that we're doing here is just self-reflective; we're able to be better women to the world for it."



BECOMING SHANNON RHODES, PROFESSIONAL ATHLETE

Shannon Rhodes has let go of the player she was in college. The outfielder who started her career at Oregon and flourished as a Longhorn. The records set and accolades earned as a collegiate star. Even the mindset and routine – she's left it behind.

There are moments when it's been sad and not easy, but it's made room for who she is now and who she has become: Shannon Rhodes, professional softball player and Athletes Unlimited 2022 Rookie of the Year.

Over the course of the year break she took from the sport, she took an important step in her journey to redefine who she is. She'd been a softball player for 10 years, since she was seven.

Rhodes needed to be something different and discover interests outside of the sport that dominated most of her life. When her career wrapped at Texas, she was confused about what she wanted to do next.

She was selected in the 2021 Athletes Unlimited Softball Draft with an open invitation to play. That seemed like the obvious next step, but it didn't feel right for her – at least not yet.

"Being a collegiate softball player or athlete at all, you don't really have too much time to explore those likes and dislikes so I didn't have any internships under my belt, I didn't have any extreme interests," Rhodes said.

Nothing about her major was particularly calling her name – if anything, she majored in softball while at Texas.

So Rhodes packed it up in Austin and went back home to Fort Worth. She started a 9-to-5 recruiting in construction, making phone calls and hiring people for jobs. It was fulfilling for her to talk to people and build relationships – that's where she thrives. In fact, it was a great experience but, "I just didn't feel like I was really maximizing my time for my potential," Rhodes said.

During that time, Rhodes helped her dad coach a 14U team in the Texas Glory organization, the same one she played in during her travel ball career. She describes her experience working with the team as "refreshing" and that it made her feel like she was stepping back into their shoes, playing softball at that age.

All she wanted at 14 was to play Division I softball, go to the world series and win.

"It just kind of lit a flame under in me, I guess," Rhodes explained. "That year was pretty much finding some passion, some love, some fire for it again."

That reignition started a nagging feeling that she wasn't done yet. The first step was a conversation with her dad. They sat down at dinner after one of the travel team practices and she threw the idea out there.

"I looked at my dad and I was like, 'Hey, I think I might wanna play again.'"

She says her dad's eyes grow wide, then he was giddy.

Not only did she want to play, but she wanted to make her family proud. Rhodes imagined looking into the stands and seeing her dad, mom, sister, grandparents, and great aunt watching her. She knew she had to play.

She reached out to the Softball Player Executive Committee to see if the offer still stood to come to the league.

"I'm really grateful that the opportunity arose again. Not a lot of people get to go back on something that they declined in the past."

Rhodes joined Athletes Unlimited for AUX in San Diego and continued her rookie year at Championship Season in Rosemont.

Her outstanding first year as a pro earned her the honors of 2022 Rookie of the Year, voted on by the player group. Through five weeks of competition, she was one of the most consistent hitters amongst the 60 athletes. She finished second in the league in home runs with eight and was the only player to have two multi-home run games in Season 3.

In 48 at-bats she logged a .375 average and .958 slugging percentage.

Her results at the plate skyrocketed since AUX and that's no accident. During the break between seasons, it gave her time to reflect and reframe her perspective.

"I think AUX was 100% me trying to figure out who am I now as Shannon: as an athlete, as a softball player, as a professional," Rhodes said. "I had the corporate professional down now I have to do the sport professional."

During her first AU media day, Rhodes was asked to describe herself as an athlete. The question was so pointed to her experiences it brought on tears. The fear of letting go of who she was in college, and doubts if she was cut out for this level.

Her answer: "I don't know, actually. That's why I'm here. I'm here to figure that out."

Approaching the end of her first summer of softball as a pro, that answer is starting to become more clear.

This Shannon Rhodes gives herself much more grace. She laughs at her mistakes and plays more freely. She fails but more importantly, she learns.

Looking back, she's thankful for the gap year she took from the sport.

"I think that's where rookies may struggle," Rhodes confirmed. "It's not knowing how to close the door on who you were, because you have to step out – through it."
