

#### ATHLETES UNLIMITED BASKETBALL BROADCAST TEAM



Athletes Unlimited Basketball fans will be able to watch every game of the 2023 season live via streaming or linear television. A selection of five games will air live on CBS Sports Network with the remaining 25 contests being available on WNBA League Passs. In addition, 14 games will also be simulcast by the Women's Sports Network and nine games can be seen on Bally Sports regional sports networks.

The broadcast tandem of play-by-play commentator **Cindy Brunson** and color analyst and Hall of Famer **Sheryl Swoopes** returns for a second season. Brunson has served as a sports anchor, play-by-play commentator and analyst for the Pac-12 Conference, Phoenix Mercury, FOX Sports Net Arizona, Bally Sports and ESPN. Swoopes, the first player ever signed by the WNBA, won a championship at every level of competition during her playing career, including three Olympic Gold medals and four WNBA titles. Swoopes is also a member of the Athletes Unlimited Advisory Board.

Joining Brunson and Swoopes as part of the broadcast team will be **Mariluz Cook**, who will specialize in player and fan engagement. Cook, who hails from Salt Lake City, Utah, is a sports anchor and sideline reporter for KSL-TV and serves as an in-arena host for the Utah Jazz.

#### **ATHLETES UNLIMITED BASKETBALL 101**

#### **WHO WE ARE**

Athletes Unlimited is a new model of professional sports where athletes are decision makers and individual players are champions of team sports. We literally change the game with faster play and fluid teams, delivering next-level competition and engagement in which every moment counts. Beginning in 2020 with Women's Softball and following with Women's Volleyball (2021), Women's Lacrosse (2021), Women's Basketball (2022) and AUX Softball (2022), Athletes Unlimited will build the next generation of both athletes and fans.

Our athletes are in charge of their team and league decisions, and of their individual success. We reboot timetables, rosters and game play to create fast and exciting competition that speaks to contemporary sports fans, bringing them close to the action and the athletes in games where every moment counts. We incorporate the player-centric model that fans love about fantasy sports. We use digital media platforms and cutting-edge technology to connect fans deeply to athletes at the top of their game on and off the field, and to the game itself.

#### **HOW THE TEAMS ARE SELECTED**

A draft will be held prior to each week's games with the top four players in the individual leaderboard serving as the team captains. The captains will then fill their rosters by selecting 10 other players. Each draft will be held on the Sunday before the week's games and can be seen via the Athletes Unlimited YouTube channel.

Uniform colors will be assigned based on the team captain's rank on the leaderboard. The top-scoring captain's team will wear gold, while the second-highest point scorer's team dons orange jerseys. The third-place team will wear blue jerseys and the fourth-place team will wear purple jerseys.

Each team will consist of 11 players and there are no limits on the number of players at a specific position (guard, forward, center, guard/forward etc.).

#### **RULES OF INTEREST**

**Timing:** Four 10-minute (10:00) stopped time quarters will be played during a regulation game with a 24-second shot clock in play. Halftime will be 15 minutes in length.

**Overtime:** If the game score is tied after regulation, a five-minute (5:00) overtime period will be played to determine the winner. Should the score remain tied following the overtime period, a subsequent "Elam Ending" period will be held with the winner of the game being the first team to score seven (7) or more points.

**Timeouts:** Each team is permitted three (3) 30-second timeouts and one (1) 60-second timeout during regulation play and all timeouts carry over from the first half to the second half. In addition, each team will be given one (1) additional 30-second timeout at the start of the overtime period in addition to any timeouts remaining prior to the period. In the event of an "Elam Ending" period, each team will receive one (1) 30-second timeout, but cannot use any other carryover timeouts.

**Media Timeouts:** One (1) media timeout will be called at the first dead ball at or below the five-minute (5:00) mark of each quarter unless a team-called timeout or Captain's Challenge occurs before that time frame. In addition, the first team-called timeout or Captain's Challenge of the second half becomes a media timeout.

**Captain's Challenges:** A captain or other determined team representative may initiate replay review of certain events subject to the provisions of the rule as set out below. Replay reviews triggered under this rule shall be referred to as a 'Captain's Challenge,' or 'Challenge' for short.

Each team is entitled to one (1) challenge in the first 38 minutes of the game and one (1) Challenge in the last two minutes of the fourth quarter, overtime period or "Elam Ending" period.

A team may utilize a Challenge to trigger replay review of the following events: (1) a called personal foul charged to its own team, and (2) a called out of bounds violation.

Replay review of the following events, among others, are not considered "challengeable" events: (1) a called personal foul charged to the opposing team, (2) continuation — i.e., whether a defensive foul occurred prior to the offensive player beginning her shooting motion, (3) a technical or flagrant foul, and (4) violations — i.e., traveling, carrying, double dribble, offensive or defensive three seconds, etc.

#### **INDIVIDUAL LEADERBOARD**

While traditional basketball statistics are kept during each Athletes Unlimited game, players earn individual points by accumulating those statistics. Points accumulated by statistics, quarter and/or game wins and MVP selections are used to create an individual leaderboard, which determines captains for each week and the individual champion at the end of the season.

Points are awarded at the following increments during the game:

If an overtime and/or "Elam Ending" period is required, the stats accumulated during the extra period(s) do not earn any individual points for the athletes on the leaderboard. In addition, there are no additional team quarter win points for the extra period(s).

In addition, athletes will be awarded 50 individual points if their team wins a single quarter. If the teams score the same number of points in a quarter, the points carry over to the next quarter.

Athletes on the winning team in each game will be awarded 150 individual points toward the individual leaderboard.

A total of three MVPs will be selected following each game by the competing athletes with the top player earning 90 points. The second MVP will receive 60 points, while the third MVP claims 30 points.

#### **POSTSEASON AWARDS**

At the conclusion of the 2023 Athletes Unlimited Basketball season, medals will be presented to the top four finishers on the leaderboard in addition to the Defensive Player of the Year and the Teammate of the Year presented by WeThink. An All-Defensive Team will also be recognized as part of the closing ceremony.

#### **ATHLETE COMPENSATION**

Athletes are compensated in three ways during an Athletes Unlimited season, including base pay, win bonuses (quarter and game wins) and a leaderboard bonus.

#### **ATHLETE CAUSES**

The Athlete Causes program, powered by Give Lively, will provide funding to charities of the players' choosing equal to 100 percent of their season win bonus and players will have the opportunity to create their own fundraising pages to support the organizations of their choice.


#### **MEDALS**

The top four players on the season's final leaderboard in addition to the Defensive Player of the Year and Defensive Player of the Year presented by WeThink will receive a medal designed and fabricated for Athletes Unlimited by Lisa Issenberg, founder of Kiitellä, inc. The front face of the medal represents the identity of Athletes Unlimited, while the back face of the medal leans into the specific sport, the year, location and words about Athletes Unlimited's vision, mission and values on and off the field - Excellence in Community and Leadership.

#### THE BOOK OF UNLIMITED

The Book of Unlimited was designed, handmade and bound for Athletes Unlimited. The book weighs nearly 25 pounds, measures approximately 12" by 18" and contains nearly 500 pages. The champion, along with all who competed, are inscribed into the book. In addition, The Book of Unlimited also contains a history of achievements in Athletes Unlimited, including stories, highlights and events.

The book is opened during the Opening Ceremony for each season and is closed after the champion is named and her name is inscribed into the book. The tradition began during Athletes Unlimited Softball's inaugural season in 2020.

#### Athletes Unlimited Seasons Hosted: 2021 & 2022 Volleyball, 2023 Basketball

Fair Park Coliseum is serving as the host for an Athletes Unlimited season for the third time, joining the 2021 and 2022 volleyball campaigns.

Built in the 1950s, Fair Park Coliseum is a multi-purpose arena located just east of Downtown Dallas inside historic Fair Park. The iconic facility features a multi-purpose floor that can be transformed into numerous surfaces for a variety of events.

Over the last seven decades, the facility's flexibility has provided the host venue for concerts, ice hockey, family shows, wrestling, speaking engagements and rodeo events in addition to Athletes Unlimited volleyball and basketball.

Fair Park is the largest historical landmark in Texas and boasts one of the nation's largest collections of 1930s art and architecture. The 277-acre campus is home to the State Fair of Texas, museums, Cotton Bowl Stadium, an outdoor amphitheater, Music Hall at Fair Park (Broadway shows, ballet, opera) and over 1,000 events each year.



## SEIMONE AUGUSTUS

FIRST SEASON LSU

Four-time WNBA Champion. Three-time Olympic Gold Medalist. Two-time Naismith Player of the Year.

Seimone Augustus brings her extensive success on the court to the Athletes Unlimited sidelines as a facilitator for the 2023 season, joining fellow LSU great Pokey Chatman.

Augustus started 365-of-391 games in the WNBA over a 15-year career (2006-20) after being taken by Minnesota with the No. 1 overall pick in the 2006 WNBA Draft. The Baton Rouge, La., product spent her first 14 seasons with the Lynx before she closed her career with the Los Angeles Sparks in 2020.

A six-time All-WNBA selection, Augustus led the Lynx to four WNBA championships (2011, 2013, 2015, 2017) and two additional WNBA Finals berths (2012, 2016). She was named as the WNBA Finals Most Valuable Player in 2011 after guiding Minnesota past Atlanta for the franchise's first league crown.

Named as one of the top 25 players in the league's history in 2021, Augustus shot 48.0 percent from the field during her career and finished with 6,005 points and 1,228 rebounds. The eight-time WNBA All-Star and 2006 WNBA Rookie of the Year stands seventh in league history with 2,455 made field goals while her 5,111 career field goal attempts rank eighth on the all-time list.

Augustus averaged 20.0 or more points per game in a season three times during her WNBA career, including a 22.6 average during the 2007 campaign when she ranked second in the league in scoring. She also netted 21.9 points per contest in her rookie season and contributed 21.0 points per game in 2009.

In addition to her WNBA career, Augustus spent seven seasons playing overseas. She led Galatasaray (Turkey) to the FIBA EuroCup title in 2008-09 and earned FIBA EuroCup Most Valuable Player honors for her efforts. She also spent two years with Dynamo Moscow (Russia) and three seasons with Dynamo Kursk (Russia).

The second-leading scorer in LSU women's basketball history, Augustus tallied 2,702 points over 140 games from 2002-06. The Lady Tigers' career record holder for games started (140) also ranks 15th in program history with 728 career rebounds while her 276 assists are 17th on the all-time ledger.

The Lady Tigers' leading scorer during all four years of her career, Augustus was named the Naismith Player of the Year as a junior and senior along with winning the Wade Trophy, Wooden Award and Honda Sports Award. She also received Southeastern Conference Player of the Year notice in both seasons after guiding LSU to back-to-back NCAA Final Four berths.

Augustus, who owns the LSU career record with an .857 career free throw percentage, holds the distinction of being one of just two players in school history to make at least 90 percent of their free throws in a season after converting 90.1 percent during the 2003-04 campaign.

After having her No. 33 jersey retired by LSU in 2010, Augustus became the first female athlete in school history to get a statue in their honor on Jan. 15, 2023. She also had her No. 33 jersey retired by the Minnesota Lynx on May 29, 2022.

Augustus' success on the hardwood extended to the international level as she guided Team USA to four Gold medals, including three Olympic Gold medals (2008, 2012, 2016). She was also a member of the 2006 FIBA World Championship team that won a Bronze medal

Honored as the 2003 USA Basketball Female Athlete of the Year, Augustus posted a 105-6 career record in international play. She authored a .530 career field goal percentage and averaged 8.3 points per contest.

## ZAK **BUNCIK**

FIRST SEASON UT ARLINGTON

Zak Buncik enters his first season as a facilitator for Athletes Unlimited Basketball.

Buncik, a 2007 graduate of UT Arlington, joins Athletes Unlimited after completing his first season as a player development coach for the WNBA's Dallas Wings. The Wings finished sixth in the league's 12-team standings with an 18-18 record and earned a spot in the playoffs during Buncik's inaugural campaign with Dallas.

Prior to joining the Wings' staff, he ran a skills development business where he worked with all levels of basketball players, including several WNBA and NBA players.

Buncik spent nine seasons as a member of Coach Scott Cross' men's basketball staff at his alma mater, guiding the Mavericks to a pair of conference titles (Southland and Sun Belt) along with the championship game of the 2013 Western Athletic Conference and 2018 Sun Belt Conference Tournaments.

Buncik, who served as a student assistant coach during his three years at UT Arlington, graduated with a bachelor's degree in kinesiology and exercise science with an emphasis in pedagogy.

# POKEY CHATMAN

SECOND SEASON LSU

Success is the word most people would use when describing the career of Pokey Chatman, who embarks on her second season as a facilitator for Athletes Unlimited Basketball.

Chatman's coaching career, which has spanned over three decades, has continued a Hall of Fame basketball journey she enjoyed as a player at Louisiana State University.

Chatman joined the coaching staff for the WNBA's Seattle Storm for the 2022 campaign and guided Seattle to a fourth place finish in the league's standings with a 22-14 record. The Storm advanced to the league semifinals before falling to the eventual champion Las Vegas Aces in four games.

In nine seasons as a WNBA head coach, Chatman compiled a 134-172 regular season record, including a 24-10 mark with Chicago in 2013. She spent six years in the Windy City as the Sky's bench boss before a three-year stint in Indiana from 2017-19.

Under Chatman's leadership, the Sky reached the WNBA Finals in 2014 in addition to Eastern Conference semifinal berths in 2013 and 2015. Chicago also reached the league's final four during Chatman's final season in 2016.

In addition to her time in the WNBA, Chatman was on the coaching staff with Women's Basketball Club Spartak in Russia for four seasons. The team won the Euroleague Women's Championship in all four seasons and posted a perfect 16-0 record with Chatman as the head coach in 2010.

Prior to her time in professional basketball, Chatman patrolled the sidelines at her alma mater for nearly two decades. The Ama, La., native was an assistant coach for legendary leader Sue Gunter from 1992-2004 before taking the helm after Gunter's retirement.

In four seasons as the Lady Tigers' bench boss, Chatman compiled a 105-19 record with three NCAA Final Four appearances and a pair of Southeastern Conference regular season titles. The consensus selection as the 2005 National Coach of the Year, Chatman earned a pair of Coach of the Year commendations from the Black Coaches Association in 2004 and 2005 and was the SEC Coach of the Year in 2005.

Chatman, a 1998 inductee into the LSU Athletics Hall of Fame, also spent time as a coach on the international level after serving as an assistant coach for Team USA at the 2005 World University Games.

The eighth-leading scorer in LSU women's basketball history, Chatman compiled 1,826 points over 120 games from 1987-88 while grabbing 446 rebounds. She shot 42.1 percent from the field, including a .365 mark from three-point range, while sinking 82.2 percent of her career free throw attempts.

One of three players in LSU women's basketball history with 1,000 career points and 500 career assists, Chatman stands third on the Lady Tigers' all-time ledger with 570 assists and owns a school-record 346 career steals. The three-time All-SEC pick also holds the school single-game marks by sinking 18 free throws on 21 attempts against No. 3 Georgia on Feb. 10, 1991.

Chatman was a consensus All-America selection by State Farm/WBCA, Basketball Weekly and the United States Basketball Writers Association as a senior after averaging 18.6 points and 5.1 assists per game. She was named as the MVP of the 1991 SEC Tournament after leading the Lady Tigers to their first league crown.

She also competed for Team USA at the 1989 World University Games in addition to being a member of the 1989 ABA-USA Junior National Team and 1990 USA Select Team.

# **CARLOS KNOX**

FIRST SEASON IUPUI

Carlos Knox carries over 20 years of coaching experience into his first season as a facilitator for Athletes Unlimited Basketball.

Knox, a 2004 inductee into the IUPUI Athletics Hall of Fame, most recently served as the interim head coach for the Indiana Fever during the 2022 WNBA season. He was also a member of the Fever coaching staff for seven seasons and helped Indiana reach the playoffs every year.

With Knox on the bench, Indiana secured the 2012 WNBA Championship and reached the WNBA Finals in 2015 while appearing in the conference final four times.

In addition to his time as a lieutenant on the Fever staff for Lin Dunn and Stephanie White, Knox spent three years as an assistant women's basketball coach at the University of North Texas. He guided the Mean Green to a 47-49 record, including an 18-win campaign in 2018-19.

Knox also worked on the women's basketball coaching staffs at San Diego State (2010-11) and Cincinnati (2020-21). He also spent seven years as a head coach on the men's side in Saudi Arabia (Al Hilal Club) and the Continental Basketball Association (Indiana Alleycats and Pittsburg Explosion).

The Dayton, Ohio, native finished his career as the most prolific scorer in IUPUI history while holding numerous school records, including the single-game (51), single-season (927) and career (2,556) scoring marks. He also closed his career in 1998 as the program's all-time leader with a 30.1 career scoring average.

Knox's name is also etched in the record books by holding the top spot on the school's career free throws made (684) and attempted (821) lists in addition to notching 499 career three-point field goal attempts.


Knox was not just known as a scorer during his time with the Jaguars as he established the program record with 204 career steals.

Knox was NCAA Division II's leading scorer in 1996-97 and was a consensus First-Team All-America selection by the National Association of Basketball Coaches, College Sports Information Directors of America and the Division II Bulletin.

After being named NCAA Division II Player of the Year in his senior season, Knox became the second student-athlete in school history to have his jersey number retired when his No. 34 was raised to the rafters on the night of his final collegiate game.

Knox spent eight years professionally overseas in Croatia, Germany, Venezuela and Italy.

# DANIELLE VIGLIONE

### PLAYER DEVELOPMENT • SECOND SEASON TEXAS

Making history has been a major part of Danielle Viglione's basketball career and she hopes to help the Athletes Unlimited players do the same as she embarks on her second season as a facilitator.

After serving as a game facilitator during the inaugural season, Viglione moves into a player development role for the 2023 campaign.

Viglione ranks fifth on the Longhorns' career list after collecting a 15.8 scoring average over 105 games from 1993-97. The Sacramento, Calif., native, who earned a trio of All-Conference accolades, knocked down a school-record 293 three-pointers and stands seventh in Texas women's basketball history with an .812 career free throw percentage.

As a freshman, Viglione averaged 21.0 points per game and set the school's freshman single-season record by finishing with 629 points. The 1994 Southwest Conference Freshman of the Year also established the Longhorns' single-season mark with 115 made three-pointers, a mark that still stands.

Viglione, who is the only player in Texas history with two career 40-point games, set the Texas single-game standard when she erupted for a program-record 48 points, including a school-record 11 three-pointers, against Houston on Jan. 29, 1994. She also netted 40 points earlier that season against Marquette.

With 1,658 career points, Viglione ranks 14th on the Longhorns' all-time list and is one of five players to average 20.0 or more points in a season.

Viglione played one season in the WNBA, appearing in six games with the Sacramento Monarchs during their inaugural season in 1997. She went on to play 10 years overseas, spending time in Israel, Turkey and Italy.

Prior to her time at Texas, Viglione earned a pair of California State Player of the Year commendations at Del Campo High School while racking up 3,089 points in three varsity seasons. The holder of 10 California state records and five national marks, she sank 379 three-point field goals and eclipsed Cheryl Miller's single-season record by scoring 1,300 points.

The owner of the Sacramento Skills Academy, Viglione was inducted into the CIF Hall of Fame in 2014 and the Sacramento Hall of Fame in 2015 before earning her spot in the UT Athletics Women's Hall of Honor in 2019.

A 1998 graduate of Texas with a bachelor's degree in kinesiology, Viglione was the recipient of the NCAA's Postgraduate Scholarship in 1997.

Isabelle Harrison, the inaugural Athletes Unlimited Basketball Defensive Player of the Year, finished third on the leaderboard with 5,373 points while ranking fifth in the circuit with a 19.3 scoring average.
