ATHLETES UNLIMITED LACROSSE 101

WHO WE ARE

Athletes Unlimited is a new model of professional sports where athletes are decision makers and individual players are champions of team sports. We literally change the game with faster play and fluid teams, delivering next-level competition and engagement in which every moment counts. Athletes Unlimited began in 2020 with Women's Softball and followed with Women's Volleyball (2021), Women's Lacrosse (2021), Women's Basketball (2022) and AUX Softball (2022). Athletes Unlimited is building the next generation of both athletes and fans.

Our athletes are in charge of their team and league decisions, and of their individual success. We reboot rosters and gameplay to create fast and exciting competition that speaks to contemporary sports fans, bringing them close to the action and the athletes in games where every moment counts. We incorporate the player-centric model that fans love about fantasy sports. We use digital media platforms and cutting-edge technology to connect fans deeply to athletes at the top of their game on and off the field, and to the game itself.

HOW THE TEAMS ARE SELECTED

A draft will be held prior to each week's games with the top four players in the individual leaderboard serving as the team captains. The captains will then fill their rosters by selecting 13 other players. Each week's draft will take place on the Monday before the respective week's games.

Uniform colors will be assigned based on the team captain's rank on the leaderboard. The top-scoring captain's team will wear gold, while the second-highest point scorer's team dons orange jerseys. The third-place team will wear blue jerseys and the fourth-place team will wear purple jerseys.

All teams will consist of 14 players, including four attackers, four midfielders, four defenders and two goalkeepers.

RULES OF INTEREST

Athletes Unlimited Lacrosse playing rules are based on the NCAA rule book with several exceptions, including:

Field Size: The field is 100 yards long by 60 yards wide with 80 yards between the goals. In addition, the restraining line is the center line, but restraining lines will be in use for the draw. Instead of an eight-meter fan, Athletes Unlimited Lacrosse will use an eight-meter "key."

Timing: Four 10-minute (10:00) stopped time quarters will be played during a regulation game with a 60-second shot clock in play. There will be a three-minute (3:00) break between the first and second quarters and third and fourth quarters. Halftime will be 15 minutes in length.

Shot Clock Reset: The 60-second shot clock will reset if a shot attempt is a goal, saved by the goalkeeper or hits the crossbar or the goal post.

Timeouts: Each team is permitted to take one timeout per quarter, but timeouts do not carry over if unused. If a team does not take a timeout before the five-minute mark of the quarter, a media timeout will be called at the next dead ball situation. The first timeout of any quarter (media or team-called) will be three minutes (3:00) in length and any subsequent timeouts in the period will be one minute (1:00) in length.

Overtime and Shootouts: In the event a game is tied at the end of regulation, a three-minute overtime period will be played following a one-minute break. If the game is still tied, a shootout will take place with teams alternating three rounds of attempts. If the shootout remains tied after three rounds, it will move into a sudden-victory format with each team alternating one shot in each subsequent round. Goals scored and saves made during the shootout do not count for a player's personal season statistics.

Foul Changes: No shooting space fouls will be called, but a dangerous shot foul can still be issued. If a shot attempt hits a player from the knee and above, a red card will be administered. In addition, defenders cannot intentionally enter the shooting space with the intent of blocking a shot, or position multiple defenders in front of the goal (walling). No three-second defensive calls will be made and no touch fouls will be called, but players cannot be displaced.


Over and Back: Teams may not go back into the defensive half of the field once they establish possession in the offensive half. If a team violates this rule, possession is turned over to the defensive team.

Captain's Challenges: Teams will be permitted two (2) challenges per game, which are communicated to the officials via the captain or facilitator. The following situations may be challenged:

- » Goals
- » Two-Point Goals
- » Whether the ball was out of the crosse when time expires in a period
- » Dangerous Shots
- » False Starts

Teams **DO NOT** retain their challenges if they are successful. The Challenge Official makes the final decision on all challenges.

Scoring: Teams may score a two-point goal if the shot is released outside the eight-meter key. In addition, goalkeepers can score with a goalkeeper crosse during game play (regulation and overtime).

INDIVIDUAL LEADERBOARD

While traditional lacrosse statistics are kept during each game, players earn individual points by accumulating those statistics. Those points are used to create an individual leaderboard, which determines captains for each week and the individual champion at the end of the season

If a game goes into overtime and/or a shootout, the stats accumulated during the extra period or shootout do not earn any individual points for the athletes on the leaderboard.

In addition, athletes will be awarded 20 individual points if their team wins a single quarter. If the teams score the same number of points (goals + two-point goals) in a quarter, the points carry over to the next quarter.

Athletes on the winning team in each game will be awarded 45 individual points toward the leaderboard


A total of three MVPs will be selected following each game by the athletes with the top player earning 45 points. The second MVP receives 30 points, while the third MVP claims 15 points.

POSTSEASON AWARDS

At the conclusion of the 2023 Athletes Unlimited Lacrosse season, medals will be presented to the top four finishers on the leaderboard in addition to the Defensive Player of the Year and the Teammate of the Year presented by weThink. An All-Defensive Team will also be recognized as part of the closing ceremony.

ATHLETE COMPENSATION

Athletes are compensated in three ways during an Athletes Unlimited season, including base pay, win bonuses (quarter and game wins) and a leaderboard bonus. The leaderboard bonus also includes an additional donation equal to 100 percent of the athlete's win bonus to their selected cause partner.



MEDALS

The top four players on the final leaderboard in addition to the Defensive Player of the Year and the Teammate of the Year presented by weThink will receive a medal designed and fabricated for Athletes Unlimited by Lisa Issenberg, founder of Kiitellä, inc. The front face of the media represents the identity of Athletes Unlimited, while the back face of the medal leans into the specific sport, the year, location and words about Athletes Unlimited's vision, mission and values on and off the field - Excellence in Community and Leadership.

THE BOOK OF UNLIMITED

The Book of Unlimited was designed, handmade and bound for Athletes Unlimited. The book weighs nearly 25 pounds, measures approximately 12" by 18" and contains nearly 500 pages. The champion's name, along with the name of all athletes who competed, are inscribed into the book. In addition, The Book of Unlimited also contains a history of achievements in Athletes Unlimited, including stories, highlights and events.

The book is opened during the Opening Ceremony for each season and is closed after the champion is named and her name is inscribed into the book. The tradition began during Athletes Unlimited Softball's inaugural season in 2020.



Athletes Unlimited Seasons Hosted: 2022 & 2023 Lacrosse

USA Lacrosse Headquarters served as the game and practice venue for Athletes Unlimited Lacrosse in 2023, marking the second straight year the facility has been the league's home. William G. Tierney Field, named in honor of Hall of Fame coach Bill Tierney, opened in September 2016 and features a GreenFields' state-of-the-art MX Trimension woven turf and woven Sine pad along with a TPE infill. The facility also includes stadium lights, a video scoreboard and public address system, shot clocks and a midfield tunnel to access two team locker rooms along with an officials' locker room.

The facility can seat 2,000 fans, including bleacher seating for 474 fans.

In addition to serving as the training facility for Team USA, the venue hosts numerous college, high school and youth games each year along with clinics for coaches, officials and players.

Just above the seating area to the stadium is the Henry A Rosenberg, Jr., Promenade, which includes The Creator's Game statue sculpted by Jud Hartmann. The statue was added from the original headquarters when USA Lacrosse moved to its current location. In addition, there are 21 pillars honoring college lacrosse programs from around the country.

The Chris Sailer Trail surrounds the south end of the field and honors 11 IWLCA Trailblazers, including Pat Genovese, Tina Sloan Green, Caroline Hausserman, Kathy Heinze, Carole Kleinfelder, Gillian Rattray, Sue Stahl, Lanetta Ware, Marge Watson and Judy Wolstenholme.

USA Lacrosse Headquarters also houses the National Lacrosse Hall of Fame and Museum, which honors the history and legends in the sport of lacrosse. It was established in 1957 and features numerous exhibits, including the Richard M. Moran Gallery and other interactive exhibits.

USA Lacrosse moved into its current facility in 2016 after being located in downtown Baltimore adjacent to Homewood Field on the Johns Hopkins University campus since 1998.

CATHERINE CONWAY

FACILITATOR FIRST SEASON

Catherine Conway finished her first season as a facilitator in Athletes Unlimited Lacrosse during the 2023 campaign.

Conway, a 2012 graduate of Boston College, served as director of athletics and physical education at the School of the Holy Child in Rye, N.Y., from August 2017 to June 2023. Under her guidance, the school's participation in athletics grew from 187 student-athletes in 2017-18 to 257 student-athletes in 2022-23.

In addition, Conway has held the position of head girls' lacrosse coach at School of the Holy Child since December 2015. She has guided the program to 75 wins, including the 2017 NYSAISAA title.

Conway is also vice president and co-owner of Snipers Elite Lacrosse, a premier girls-only club lacrosse program serving student-athletes in Westchester County, N.Y.

Conway joined the staff of Ireland Lacrosse in October 2014 as an assistant coach for the Women's Senior National Team in addition to being the sports information director for the Women's National Program. Led by Conway, the squad authored a fifth place finish at the 2015 European Lacrosse Championship and a seventh place showing at the 2019 European Lacrosse Championship.

Conway, who earned a bachelor's degree in communications with a focus in marketing, advertising and business communication from Boston College, was the first player in program history to receive the Wells Crowther No. 19 jersey.



CRYSTI **FOOTE**

FACILITATOR
SECOND SEASON

Crysti Foote completed her second season as a facilitator for Athletes Unlimited Lacrosse during the 2023 campaign.

Foote, a four-year letter winner at Notre Dame, compiled 161 goals with 76 assists while appearing in 66 games for the Fighting Irish from 2003-06. She also notched 101 ground balls with 103 draw controls in her career.

A two-time IWLCA All-America selection, Foote claimed consensus First-Team All-America honors from the IWLCA, Inside Lacrosse and WomensLacrosse.com as a senior after ranking second in NCAA Division I by averaging 3.89 goals and 6.0 points per game. She was a 2006 Tewaaraton Award Finalist while piloting Notre Dame to a 15-4 record and a berth in the NCAA semifinals.

Foote, the 2006 IWLCA Attack Player of the Year, led the Fighting Irish in goals, assists, points and draw controls during her junior and senior seasons. Her 114 points during the 2006 campaign stand as the program single-season standard while her 74 goals in that season are the second-highest total in program history.

Foote ranks fifth on the Fighting Irish's career goals and assists lists while her 237 points are good for fourth in Notre Dame annals. She also scored a goal in 29 consecutive games from April 22, 2005 to May 26, 2006, a mark that ranks sixth in Notre Dame history.

In addition to her outstanding college career, Foote was a four-time participant in the World Lacrosse Women's World Championship with Team Canada, helping the squad earn a Bronze medal in 2009 and a Silver medal in 2013.

After her collegiate playing career, Foote spent two years as an assistant coach at Drew University before joining the staff at Columbia in 2008. She also served as head coach at Madison High School before returning to her alma mater as an assistant coach in 2010.

Following a four-year stint as the offensive coordinator at the University of Louisville, Foote joined the staff at the University of Florida in 2016 and helped the Gators win back-to-back Big East Conference championships in 2016 and 2017.

Foote moved to New Jersey after her college coaching career and was the director of Centercourt Lacrosse and head coach of Ridgewood Girls Lacrosse.

Foote currently lives in Colorado and is the founder and CEO of Best Foote Forward Lacrosse along with being co-director of Urban Elite Lacrosse. She is also the head coach of Regis Jesuit Girls Lacrosse in addition to being an assistant coach for the USA Women's Box Lacrosse team.

Foote earned her bachelor's degree in marketing from the Mendoza College of Business at Notre Dame in 2006 before receiving a master's degree in guidance counseling from Long Island University in 2012.

Born in Mimico, Ontario, Canada, Foote moved to Suffern, N.Y., in middle school. She comes from a successful lacrosse family as her father, William, was inducted into the Ontario Lacrosse Hall of Fame in 1997 along with the Mimico Lacrosse Wall of Fame in 2009.

In addition, Foote's older brother, Cullan, was a hockey and lacrosse player. Her younger sister, Julie, played with her on Team Canada in addition to being a teammate at Notre Dame.

FACILITATOR
SECOND SEASON

Amber Hill completed her second season as a facilitator for Athletes Unlimited Lacrosse in 2023

Hill made nine appearances with three starts during the inaugural Athletes Unlimited Lacrosse campaign in 2021. She notched a season-high 10 saves against Team Treanor on August 1, and notched seven saves in the Week Two opener against Team Arsenault.

A 2009 graduate of Syracuse, Hill ranks third on the Orange's career list with a .511 save percentage and stands second in program history with 193 saves during the 2007 campaign. She also paced the Big East Conference by averaging 10.17 saves per game in 2007 while earning Most Outstanding Player honors at the Big East Championship.

Hill graduated from Syracuse with a bachelor's degree in political science from the Maxwell School of Citizenship and Public Affairs with a double minor in legal studies and native studies

Hill, who served as captain of the Haudenosaunee Nationals from 2006-19, competed in four World Lacrosse Women's World Championships and one Pan-American Lacrosse Association World Championship Qualifier.

In her box lacrosse career, Hill won Gold medals as a captain in 2017, 2018 and 2022 with the Six Nations Snipers in the Arena Lacrosse League. She also secured a pair of Gold medals in the Women's Major Series Lacrosse League, winning with the Niagara Turtle Islanders in 2015 and the Grand River Attack in 2016.

In addition, Hill was also one of the youngest Division I head coaches when she served as the bench boss at Niagara University during the 2012 season at the age of 24. She was inducted into the North American Indigenous Hall of Fame in 2023 for her playing career and contributions to the sport of lacrosse as an athlete, coach, and official.

Along with her coaching experience, Hill was a member of the Niagara Arts and Cultural Board of Directors and was the director of public relations and communications for the Haudenosaunee Nationals Board of Directors. She also served as Chair of the Niagara Falls Human Rights Commission and served on the World Lacrosse Women's Box Lacrosse Working Group in addition to the World Lacrosse Box Lacrosse Rules Subcommittee.

MAIREAD DURKIN BRINGS GAELIC FOOTBALL ROOTS TO ATHLETES UNLIMITED LACROSSE

To say Mairead Durkin rode the roller coaster of feelings upon being drafted by Athletes Unlimited would be putting it mildly.

From disbelief to flattery to elation, Durkin experienced it all when the call came to kick off her professional lacrosse career.

"Oh my goodness, absolutely," she said. "To be drafted? It was such an honor. I'm so grateful. I was not expecting it at all. It was like out of the blue. Initially I thought when people are getting drafted for sports, the coaches have to put your name somewhere. No one asked me anything.

"I was upstairs taking a final for cyber intelligence and my roommates and teammates were downstairs watching a movie. They were like, ''Read, you were drafted.' The first thing I did was look at my phone, and it was my goalie coach and his two sons with the thumbs up and my name and face on the screen. I was like, 'What the heck his going on?' I wasn't really sure what was going on. I am so grateful and humble to have been given this opportunity and to be able to continue playing this sport at professional level. It's a dream come true."

In Durkin, Athletes Unlimited is getting one of its most interesting players across the spectrum of all four of its sports.

Growing up, she played all manner of sports, some conventional and one very unconventional, at least when it comes to awareness in the United States.

Let's go on this journey with her.

It looked like basketball might be Durkin's sport when she was growing up in Stony Point, New York. But not wanting to be confined by four walls, she eventually chose the great outdoors and lacrosse.

"It wasn't like I was going to choose which one I was going to play in college," she said. "When I was in sixth or seventh grade, my best friend and I joined a travel team, Metro Club Lacrosse. The whole point of joining club lacrosse is to eventually get recruited. In high school, I was getting looked at by a few colleges for basketball. I honestly thought about it. I was like, 'Hmm.' I do miss basketball, but I really did want to play lacrosse. I love lacrosse. I think I need to be outside. I love being outside."

There was one notable detour in Durkin's athletic career that kept her outdoors, with an international flavor

The sport of Gaelic football might not be well known in the United States, but it's a wildly entertaining sport that blends the best of soccer, rugby, and basketball. Durkin starred in the sport, helping to lead the U.S. women's team to a gold medal in 2016, when she was 16.

For Durkin, Gaelic football is a family affair. Her dad, Shane, starred for County Sligo in Ireland before he came to the United States.

"My dad was a midfielder for County Sligo, and he was just incredible," Durkin said. "He came over to America, to New York, to play at Manhattan College, at Gaelic Park. He came over when he was 24 or 25, and that's where he met my mom. He was playing with my mom's brothers — my mom is one of seven. She has four brothers, and they were all playing with my dad. In America, the clubs here will get the best Gaelic people to come over and play.

"I wish there was more video of it. I wish there was more footage, but they only have the county finals. He definitely got me into it. My brother's going to be 30 and my sister is going to be 27. They grew up playing, too. My brother is still playing. He could play forever."

Durkin says there is much from Gaelic football that transfers to lacrosse.

"Absolutely," she said. "With both Gaelic football and lacrosse, you need to have strong hand-eye coordination. With Gaelic, you need to control the ball while you're running and going through opponents. You're cradling the ball in your stick in lacrosse. You've got to be able to catch and throw and also be able to pass, especially with defense – footwork and agility. They're both very fast sports. They require quick changes in direction and nimble footwork."

And of course, there's the physical aspect of both sports, something Durkin says she enjoys.

"Physicality, yeah," she said. "It's a little bit different. I'm really excited because pro (lacrosse) seems a lot more physical and lenient with the calls. But physicality for sure. You've got to be able to take it, maybe not give too much. I've never been one to be able to flop. Back in the old days, it was, 'Mairead, you've got to fall down.' Why would I fall down if I was still up? I can't find it in me to fake. That's not who I am."

Despite her friendly nature, Durkin cuts a stern figure on the lacrosse field.

"Oh yeah — apparently," she said with a knowing laugh. "I'm not going to lie. When I'm in the game, I'm not laughing. I'm not talking to anyone. I am stone cold. I'm competitive, but I'm not mean. I don't trash talk. I don't say anything. If they're intimidated, I'm sorry."

Fans watching Athletes Unlimited Lacrosse this season can expect to see a strong defensive presence from Durkin. But defense wasn't always her thing. She switched from midfield to defense early in her college career at James Madison University.

"What prompted me was freshman year, I didn't play much," she said. "There was incredible talent. I knew I didn't deserve to play. I was like, 'I don't know how these people are doing what they're doing.' I hated being on the sidelines. Who likes to be on the sidelines? I want to play. My sophomore fall came around, and we got a new coach, Kateri Linville. She's a saint. She's the most incredible woman I've ever met. She became our defensive coach.

"After fall-ball games, she came up to me at the end. She said, 'Have you ever thought about playing defense?' I remember being like, 'I will do whatever.' I told them in my meeting I would literally ref if it means getting on the field. I do not care. I would love to play. Our captain at the time, Emma Johnson, helped me out a lot. People graduated. We had a really strong defense, and that was the year a lot of them graduated. I was just so completely open and excited just to be considered. I literally thought, 'I'm never going to play here,' so I was really excited and open. I really love defense. I don't know if I would be able to do midfield right now, the running up and down crazy."

The switch marked an important turning point in Durkin's lacrosse career. She wound up with the most turnovers caused (135) in JMU history in addition to winning several awards, including being a Tewaaraton Award nominee.

"I came from being my high school's leading goal scorer to defense," she said. "But I love defense. I would not change it for the world."

She also was a five-year letter winner at James Madison and takes huge pride in a program that won a national championship the season before she arrived and one that may not be the first on people's lips when they talk about college women's lacrosse.

"That kind of hits home because I was on the team for five years," she said. "Since then the program has still been Top 15, a lot of times Top 10, Top 12. I honestly feel like for them not to be talked about as much is kind of wild to me because there are teams ranked a lot higher and are more talked about because years and years ago they might have won. I feel James Madison is a phenomenal program. I had the best experience in the world. All the people on my team were my best friends. I'm not kidding, I felt God put every person on that team, and we all looked around at each other like, 'How do we love each other this much?'

"At a lot of schools you hear about a lot of people not really enjoying their time because they're talked about more and they're assumed to be higher or more competitive or whatever. But our program is just so competitive. It's so loving."

In preparation for her first season of Athletes Unlimited lacrosse, Durkin has been busy putting names with faces and learning about her new teammates, with an assist from rookie goalie Kat Buchanan, with whom Durkin played at James Madison.

"She's the best version ever," Durkin said. "She's a lax nerd. She knows everything about everyone. At AU, they draw talent in from everywhere. I'm looking forward to being given the chance to learn from these incredible athletes and go head to head with them. I love competing. I hate to lose. But I love to compete and learn. When someone can do something I can't, it just kind of throws me off. And all these people surrounding me can do everything, and they're incredible. When I see something, I want to learn from them. So I'm really excited to be surrounded by all this greatness.

"My goal is just to make the most out of this experience. I don't really know what to expect. When I was drafted, I was shocked. I wasn't even sure I was going to do it. But after doing more research, I was like, 'Oh, this is unbelievable. This sounds awesome.' So I guess my goals is to take it day by day, work hard, learn from everyone, have fun, because this feels like a summer camp so far. Just work as hard as I can, play for my teammates and win."

MARGE DONOVAN LAUNCHES ROOKIE SEASON WITH ATHLETES UNLIMITED LACROSSE

Marge Donovan harbors dreams that are literally out of this world.

For now, though, she remains firmly rooted on terra firma as she launches her first year of Athletes Unlimited Lacrosse.

Donovan was part of Athletes Unlimited's 2023 Draft Class after being a four-year letter-winner at Princeton University in a career spanning 2018-22 and spending a season as a graduate student at the University of Maryland. As a student, she earned her degree in aerospace engineering.

Perhaps one day, or some starry night, she'll fulfill one of her dreams of becoming an astronaut

"It's definitely been a dream of mine," she said. "This is going to sound corny, but definitely shoot for the stars. We'll see what happens. I'm someone who goes after their dreams. I've been extremely lucky to have support along the way and support for my dreams. So ... we'll see."

Donovan, a defender, joins Athletes Unlimited after a decorated collegiate career and helping Team USA win the silver medal at the 2022 World Games.

At Princeton, she earned three All-America honors and was the Tigers' career record holder for draw controls (214) and the single-season leader (112 in the 2022 season). She also won an Ivy League Defender of the Year award.

With the chance to play for her home-state school, this native of Catonsville, Maryland, joined the Terps for the 2023 season, and she placed second on the team with 19 caused turnovers and third with 24 ground balls. That put her on the Tewaaraton Watch List.

So in earthly terms, Donovan enjoyed the best of both worlds during her college playing days.

"They were both just so wonderful," she said. "It was really cool to get such different experiences. Pre-COVID, it was rare for somebody to transfer. It was rare for people to go and play in grad school. It was a really cool opportunity to get a whole new perspective on the academic and athletic (sides). It was interesting."

With strong support staffs at both Princeton and Maryland, Donovan was able to maintain the balance between classroom and lacrosse field. Her path to study aerospace engineering began quite unexpectedly at McDonogh High School.

"In high school, I wanted to be a journalist up until my senior year, when I took an intro to engineering class with Mr. Steve Eno," Donovan said. "He was just an incredible teacher and opened my eyes to the world of engineering. I hadn't really considered it before. But the way he taught and the different projects we did were so cool.

"The rest is history. Since then, I just wanted to be an engineer. At Princeton, I was able to combine my interests in that and in outer space. That was more of a hobby for me. I could finally mesh together my academic interests and my hobbies. It was really cool."

If there's a lighter side to this weighty topic, it's that Donovan has a springer spaniel named Carl. Yep, he's named after Carl Sagan, who was renowned in his lifetime for groundbreaking work in astronomy and related fields.

"Carl Sagan, yes," Donovan said. "I have a pillow of my dog. I could not think of a more unfitting name for this dog than Carl Sagan. He is such a goofball, my dog Carl."

Donovan now turns her attention to matters of time and space on the lacrosse field, where she will defend against some of the best attackers in the world.

"They're so accomplished," she said. "They've won every award under the sun, but they're also really inspiring women. Even talking to them and hearing them talk, the way they carry themselves, even though they're only a couple of years older than me, they really are like role models and people I've looked up to. So that's been really neat."

In most lacrosse settings, all glory goes to the goal scorers. But under Athletes Unlimited's unique points-scoring system, defense is rewarded as well.

"It's really cool," Donovan said. "I think it just introduces another layer of competition to the game. And you already have extremely competitive people. As a result, you get some really fun lacrosse. One thing I really, really like, though, is that, yes, points are on the line, money is on the line, but it definitely doesn't stop people from being creative and trying new things with the game."

Donovan also embraces Athletes Unlimited's community involvement, noting lacrosse's unique historic roots.

"Besides the actual format of the game, I think what really sets it apart is the dedication Athletes Unlimited has in giving back and especially to the lacrosse community," she said. "Lacrosse is really different from any other sport because it has indigenous roots, and I think that's really important to recognize. Athletes Unlimited is really a pioneer in the sense of how they acknowledge, like all lacrosse communities should be doing, the indigenous roots of the game, underserved communities, marginalized communities and the importance they put on the players to care about that, as well. I think that is what really sets it apart."

As far as her own on-field goals are concerned, let's just say Donovan is keeping them well grounded even as she prepares for liftoff.

"I'm definitely like a more process oriented person," she said. "I think this year I want to give my best effort, be the best teammate I can be and really lean into this experience because it seems like such a once-in-a-lifetime experience. I just really want to lean into it, learn the rules, enjoy playing while being competitive and just give it my best."

APUZZO-MORENO RIVALRY FILLED WITH FIERCE COMPETITION ON FIELD, MUTUAL RESPECT OFF IT

Whether it's in lacrosse, hockey or soccer, there is nothing like the confrontation between shooter and goalkeeper.

Eyes locked on each other.

One sees an opening. One tries to close the opening.

And in a hold-your-breath split second, the ball or puck is either in the back of the net or is turned away or smothered.

Cheers on one side. Groans on the other

That one-on-one drama is on display week in and week out in Athletes Unlimited Lacrosse.

The shooter is Sam Apuzzo.

The goalkeeper is Taylor Moreno.

They are two of the world's best, and their confrontations have been historic, going back to their days in college (Moreno at North Carolina and Apuzzo at Boston College) and now in Athletes Unlimited.

In a game on July 30 of this year, Apuzzo scored three goals on Moreno, who despite that, set an AU single-game record for saves with 17.

"It's honestly funny how we keep ending up in these positions where we're pitted up against each other on the field," Moreno said. "It's been quite an exhilarating experience. It's certainly something that's dated back to when we were both still in college because BC was such a phenomenal team. I feel like it's always been a tough, high-level rivalry that clearly is continuing to trickle into the professional leagues."

The day ended up being a little more memorable for Apuzzo, whose team went home with an 8-7 victory.

"It was fun," Apuzzo said. "Taylor is such a great competitor and an amazing goalie. Playing against her so much, it's hard because she's such a great goalie. But I think it's such a fun competitive thing that we both have. It's very respectful. It's not like with either of us that there's a negativity towards it, which is amazing. It's such a great aspect of this league to be able to compete against people you competed with in college. And professionally, to keep moving that forward is awesome."

Moreno and Apuzzo enter the final week of competition 1-2, respectively, on the leaderboard. Their rivalry is one of fierce competition on the field and mutual respect off of it.

"I think it's super high," Apuzzo said. "I respect her beyond lacrosse. She and I have a great relationship off the field. We're very friendly. She's just a good part of this league in showing just how competitive the goalies are, how great and skillful every aspect of the player is."

Between the pipes, Moreno knows what she's up against when Apuzzo has the ball and is bearing down on her.

"She's an awesome player, a great leader," the goalkeeper said. "She has such a high lacrosse IQ. She's just a really great person off the field. Having that relationship off the field with her and being friendly and being able to have those conversations, whether it's about lacrosse or not about lacrosse is something that I'm super appreciative of. I think the competition that she and I have on the field is also fueled by our desire to win and our competitiveness and certainly drives both of our performances on the field, especially when we're up against each other."

As experienced as each player is and as many times as they have faced each other, both know that there's only a limited amount of "going to school" on each other they can do to learn tendencies and to try to gain an edge.

After all, a shot can come with a flick of the wrist.

"As you have more opportunities to play against people, it's learning what their tendencies are and using that to my advantage," Moreno said. "But at the same time, Sam manages to find a way to win and to put balls into the back of the net and keep the ball in the offensive end

"I think for her it's not just putting balls into the back of the net. It's assisting other people, creating a lot of opportunities off of the attention that she draws and then at the end of the day, she has an absolutely incredible ride, which I think, for her, creates a lot more opportunities for them to have the ball. It's just a testament to how hard she works. I think for me it's about continuing to pay attention and work on my own skills and my own techniques to continue to stay at that level and compete."

Apuzzo points out that for as much preparation she can do to learn about opposing keepers, they're doing the same to learn about shooters.

"They're constantly adapting and constantly watching our tendencies," she said. "So it's really kind of hard to scout in any way, offensively, defensively, goalie wise, just because the game is moving so fast. There are so many things that contribute to how you're getting shots, where you're shooting those shots. There's not a ton you can do. Plus, everything is changing week to week. It's hard to have something set for each player."

In fact, Apuzzo said she can't think of a goal she has scored against Moreno that resulted from studying her rival.

"Honestly, not really," she said. "It's always like you cross your fingers every time you release the ball, whether it's a save or not, just kind of hoping you get one past her that particular time, but you never know what saves she can make because of how great a goalie she is."

For as great as each player is, they don't get to play with each other much because each is a frequent captain. Last season, Moreno won the individual title with Apuzzo finishing second. Of course, the idea of being teammates appeals to both.

"The last time I actually was on her team was when she drafted me Week One of my rookie season to her team in Orange," Moreno said. "That was just an awesome opportunity, and it was probably one of the first times that we've literally played in a game together besides training next to each other at (Team) U.S. She's just a great leader, and she certainly makes things happen. Any opportunity that I'd ever get to be on her team again would be pretty nice. Especially for me, I would appreciate not having her shoot on me every weekend. Hopefully one day we'll see that happen again."

Said Apuzzo: "It would be amazing. I think Kenzie Kent said it gives you so much freedom offensively to have a goaltender like her behind you. It is a bummer that I can't play with her, but I know how incredible it is because I had gotten to play with her last year in that first weekend"

Just as in hockey and soccer, most of the glory goes to the goal scorers. But with Athletes Unlimited's unique individual point-scoring system, goalkeepers and defenders can and do dominate the top of the leaderboard with regularity.

"Obviously with the league being as unique as it is, it's a great opportunity for the defensive side of the field to have a little bit of recognition," Moreno said. "But at the same time, I think as the league continues to evolve, we'll definitely see a more balanced Top 10. If you're winning games, that's where you're going to see a lot of your points come from. I think at the end of the day, while you still want to play great defense and you still want to get and accumulate some stat points, you certainly want to be on a team that has successful weekends. That's where everyone is going to find their success in terms of points. I definitely think it's nice to see there is an opportunity for defensive players to see a little bit more payoff for their play.

"I think 2022 was certainly an incredible year for me lacrosse wise. Winning a national championship and then winning the league was super special. I was just grateful for the opportunity to be there. At the end of the day, it was just about going out and having fun and playing to the best of my ability."

Another hallmark of Athletes Unlimited is that players compete hard on the lacrosse and softball fields and basketball and volleyball courts, but when the games are done, those same players demonstrate compassion for and camaraderie with each other.

"I think it's such a special thing, especially coming from the college level, where you're so connected to your team and the belief in your team," Apuzzo said. "Here, there are no (permanent) teams. I think the fact that we're all so competitive, we're all so hyper-focused on winning that moment or winning that game, and then once we step off the field, we all have so much respect for one another because we all know what it takes to be at this level.

"What you sacrifice and what you're doing to be here, I think that respect forms relationships and forms friendships. It really emphasizes the whole part of the league where it is this group of really strong, powerful women to create this sports league. It's a group thing that we need all 56 players to do."

ROOKIE TO CAPTAIN: ABBY BOSCO EXCELS IN DEBUT PRO SEASON

Abby Bosco has handled everything that's come her way during her young professional lacrosse career. And she's done so with grace, humility and a well-placed sense of wonder.

How about being the fourth selection in the 2023 Athletes Unlimited Draft, making her part of a strong and large group of rookies?

"I was extremely honored," she said. "Hearing the announcement and the things high-caliber players had to say and the fact that they picked me, I was extremely honored and flattered."

Bosco, a defender, quickly showed she was worthy of those kind words and the high draft slot as she earned her way into a Week Three captain's spot because of her high position on the leaderboard.

"It's been awesome," she said. "I've been really focusing on having fun with all of it. I've been so fortunate that after my last college game, my career wasn't over. That was exciting in and of itself. Never did I imagine in my first season that I would be a captain. It's just kind of embracing the moment and just really enjoying it and having fun."

Of course, being a captain is a weighty responsibility for a veteran player, let alone a rookie. As daunting as the task was coming into this past weekend, Bosco had the presence of mind to seek the advice and counsel of the veterans.

"The first time, when I finished close to the top four and being a captain, I was like, 'Oh, geez, that was close,' she said. "I wasn't really thinking about it at all. When they said, 'You're a captain the next week,' I kind of panicked a little.' I was like, 'I have never drafted a team before. How do I do this?'

"The older girls were super helpful, specifically Alex Aust Holman. She was one of my coaches at Maryland. She gave me such awesome advice and was really like, 'This is an honor. You should be excited. You've earned this. Go with your gut.' So that was super helpful. Every time you draft a player, you're in a breakout room. I really learned and leaned on my facilitator, Crysti Foote as well as the players I drafted."

Bosco comes to Athletes Unlimited after a stellar college career. She starred for four years at Ivy League Penn before transferring to Big Ten power Maryland. In so many ways, she got the best of both collegiate worlds, both in the classroom and on the lacrosse field as she earned numerous academic and athletic awards.

"Oh, absolutely, I think that's the best way to put it," she said. "When COVID happened, I was like, 'Wow, nothing good will ever come of this.' Being able to have a totally different and unique experience at Maryland was a silver lining to it all. It truly was two amazing experiences but two completely different experiences.

"I think there's a ton of rules and regulations with the lvy (League) in limiting how much you can play in the off-season. The lvy League is fantastic, but the Big Ten is known for its competition. Being able to play lacrosse, not only for the University of Maryland, the most storied program, but also to be able to play in the Big Ten was just one of the coolest experiences."

Bosco's path somewhat mirrors that of AU lacrosse player Marge Donovan, who played at Princeton of the Ivy League before also moving to Maryland. The two shared a season at Maryland and have been able to talk about their similar experiences.

"When she first got to Maryland, we definitely talked about our times at Penn and Princeton and kind of compared notes and found a lot of similarities," Bosco said. "And we obviously had that shared unique experience of then being able to go and play in the Big Ten. It was definitely cool to have someone who came literally from the same, exact experience that I kind of went through with the Ivies."

ALWAYS WITH HER

If Abby Bosco needs to draw any extra inspiration in life or on the field, she can look skyward or at her wristbands at the initials of her father. Abby was only two years old on Sept. 11, 2001, when her dad, Rich Bosco, lost his life in the terrorist attacks on the World Trade Center in New York City.

"He's been kind of that rock for me, throughout college, too," she said. "Whenever I'm struggling in a game personally or as a team where we needed a reset, I would always look down at his initials. But I think having the opportunity to play professionally and do what I'm doing, I think about him being able to be in the stands.

"I think it just stems from my family telling me how proud they are, how proud he would have been of me. It's just ... I don't even know how to describe the feeling. But knowing how much he would have loved seeing what I'm doing today. He was such a sports guy. This would be everything to him. He would be a super fan. My family's been to at least two games a week. It's been awesome having them in the stands. I feel like when they're there, he's there, carrying on his name with me."

Even though she may have only faint memories of her dad, Bosco talks with pride in how he influenced and continues to influence her life.

"It's a big piece of my life, and it's shaped me in who I am in a ton of ways," she said. "So I think it's so important to be able to talk about it and how it's shaped me with being resilient and going through something like that and being appreciative of the little things."

MORE TO GIVE

Like most of the athletes across the four sports of Athletes Unlimited, Abby Bosco was attracted by the chance to continue playing the sport she loves as well as to have a voice in the league.

"I would say the fact that I get to share the field with some of the all-time greats of this sport in Sam Apuzzo, Kenzie Kent, Taylor Moreno, the list goes on and on," she said. "It's crazy. In college, you think you're playing at this high level, and you step up to the Athletes Unlimited field. I've grown up watching and playing against these players and them being on top of the scouting report. And now, every single game you go into at Athletes Unlimited, there's no weak link. You're playing against the best talent in the world and sharing the field with the best talent in the world, which is such a fun, rewarding and humbling and honoring experience. Yeah, I think that's the coolest part.

"When I did my final two years at Maryland, I still felt like I had more to give. I still loved the game and was still passionate about it. I definitely haven't felt that burnout at all yet. So it's the opportunity to continue playing at the highest level with the best talent in the world and also to continue to grow the game."

Growing the game means growing it on and off the field. It has left Bosco with a feeling of being empowered.

"It's so cool," she said. "We have some sessions called, 'In the Crease,' run by some of the PEC (Player Executive Committee) board members. Just the other day we were sitting there, and I was like, 'This is such a cool and unique experience.' It's so empowering. I feel I'm around such an amazing group of 56 women. It is so empowering, the fact that AU sees all that and really values all of that. It is, I think, so important to growing lacrosse and women's lacrosse specifically, for sure.

"I think all those things are what makes Athletes Unlimited so unique and so cool. It's so cool to not only play lacrosse and do what I love professionally but to be surrounded by people where we can have discussions like that."

Bosco is a rookie, albeit one who is wise beyond her years. Her goals moving forward are simple.

"I could have never dreamt this or imagined it, honestly," she said. "I just wanted to play, to continue doing what I love and having fun. So I think my goals going forward are to keep having fun with it and playing inspired. I've had the opportunity to meet so many new people who I played against in college. It's so cool to be able to play with maybe your enemies in college, and now I just love getting to play with them and having fun and meeting new people, with the emphasis on the fun. That's where it all stems from."
