HISTORY CHANNEL: Goalkeeper **Taylor Moreno** earned the 2022 Athletes Unlimited Lacrosse title after edging attacker **Sam Apuzzo** by 16 points on the final leaderboard ... Midfielder **Ally Mastroianni** followed in third place with 1,399 points, while goalkeeper **Britt Read** rounded out the medalists in fourth place with 1,394 points.

🌀 The 16-point difference between Moreno and Apuzzo marked the second-smallest final margin in a season in Athletes Unlimited history ... Pitcher **Danielle O'Toole** owned a 14-point edge over pitcher **Rachel Garcia** at the end of the 2022 AUX Softball season.

AW, SHOOT: Athletes Unlimited Lacrosse will have new shootout procedures for the 2023 campaign ... A three-round shootout will take place if the game remains tied after a three-minute overtime period ... In addition, if the shootout is tied after the three rounds, a sudden-victory format will follow with each team attempting one shot in subsequent rounds until a winner is declared.

🌀 Team Apuzzo beat Team Moreno by a 3-2 margin in the first shootout in league history on July 30, 2022 ... The shootout featured two sets of three rounds under the former rules.

THAT'S THE POINT: The Athletes Unlimited Lacrosse scoring system will feature several changes this season, including adjustments to points for turnovers, caused turnovers, goalkeeper saves and goals allowed by a goalkeeper.

🌀 Players will now lose 10 points for a turnover compared to eight points in the first two seasons ... In addition, a caused turnover has been increased to 14 points after being valued at 12 points in 2021 and 2022.

🌀 Goalkeeper saves will now be worth five points, a one-point reduction from the first two seasons ... In addition, a goalkeeper will lose two points for every goal allowed.

WELCOME BACK: All four medalists from the 2022 Athletes Unlimited Lacrosse season return for the 2023 campaign, marking the second time in Athletes Unlimited history that all four medalists come back for the following campaign ... The 2021 Athletes Unlimited Softball Championship Season featured all four medalists from the previous year.

MELTING POT: The 2023 Athletes Unlimited Lacrosse roster features former athletes from 18 different schools ... North Carolina leads all institutions with 12 representatives, while Maryland has seven alumnae on the 56-player roster.

🌀 Rutgers and Vanderbilt are making an appearance on the Athletes Unlimited Lacrosse roster for the first time ... Attacker **TT Naslonski** graduated as Rutgers' all-time leader in goals (187) and points (266) after playing in a school-record 79 games from 2018-22.

🌀 Vanderbilt has two former players on the roster this season ... Midfielder **Brianne Gross** scored 118 goals with 49 assists during her five seasons with the Commodores, while defender **Melissa Hawkins** appeared in a school-record 79 games.

LET'S RUN IT BACK: Goalkeeper **Taylor Moreno** can become the first player in any Athletes Unlimited sport to repeat as a champion after winning the 2022 title ... Midfielder **Taylor Cummings** was the inaugural Athletes Unlimited Lacrosse champion in 2021, but did not return to play last summer.

🌀 Moreno is the fifth Athletes Unlimited champion to return in the following season to defend their title, joining **Cat Osterman** (2020 Softball), **Aleshia Ocasio** (2021 Softball), **Bethania De La Cruz** (2022 Volleyball) and **Dejah Mulipola** (2022 Softball Championship Season) ... De La Cruz and Mulipola will defend their titles during the upcoming seasons.

TWICE AS NICE: Rookie attacker **Hailey Rhatigan** hopes to win her second lacrosse title of the 2023 calendar year after leading Northwestern to the NCAA crown ... Rhatigan, who scored seven goals in two games during Championship Weekend, guided the Wildcats to their first NCAA championship since 2012.

🌀 Goalkeeper **Taylor Moreno** earned a pair of championships in 2022 ... Prior to her record-setting effort with Athletes Unlimited, Moreno piloted North Carolina to the NCAA title.

A IS FOR APUZZO: Attacker **Sam Apuzzo**, who has been a medalist in each of the first two Athletes Unlimited Lacrosse seasons, enters the 2023 campaign as the league's career leader in goals (60), points (88), shots (169), shots on goal (111) and leaderboard points (3,467) ... The former Boston College performer also stands second on the league's all-time list with 25 career assists.

🌀 Apuzzo has registered a point in all 27 career games, while scoring a goal in 26-of-27 contests ... She also owns a league-record 11 hat tricks.

RETURN ENGAGEMENT: Attacker **Charlotte North** made a major impact on the Athletes Unlimited Lacrosse record book during her rookie campaign last summer ... The former Boston College star set new league single-season marks with eight two-point goals and 50 points while netting a league-high 31 goals.

🌀 North also established new single-game records for goals (6), two-point goals (3) and points (10) against Team Glynn on August 14, 2022.

HAPPY BIRTHDAY: Attacker **Cortney Fortunato** will celebrate her birthday on Friday (July 21).

COACH SPEAK: Attacker **TT Naslonski** was elevated to a full-time assistant coach position at Rutgers on Wednesday after serving as a volunteer assistant during the 2023 campaign.

WHO WE ARE

Athletes Unlimited is a new model of professional sports where athletes are decision makers and individual players are champions of team sports. We literally change the game with faster play and fluid teams, delivering next-level competition and engagement in which every moment counts. Athletes Unlimited began in 2020 with Women's Softball and followed with Women's Volleyball (2021), Women's Lacrosse (2021), Women's Basketball (2022) and AUX Softball (2022). Athletes Unlimited is building the next generation of both athletes and fans.

Our athletes are in charge of their team and league decisions, and of their individual success. We reboot rosters and gameplay to create fast and exciting competition that speaks to contemporary sports fans, bringing them close to the action and the athletes in games where every moment counts. We incorporate the player-centric model that fans love about fantasy sports. We use digital media platforms and cutting-edge technology to connect fans deeply to athletes at the top of their game on and off the field, and to the game itself.

HOW THE TEAMS ARE SELECTED

A draft will be held prior to each week's games with the top four players in the individual leaderboard serving as the team captains. The captains will then fill their rosters by selecting 13 other players. Each week's draft will be held on the Monday before the respective week's games and can be seen via the Athletes Unlimited YouTube channel.

Uniform colors will be assigned based on the team captain's rank on the leaderboard. The top-scoring captain's team will wear gold, while the second-highest point scorer's team dons orange jerseys. The third-place team will wear blue jerseys and the fourth-place team will wear purple jerseys.

All teams consist of 14 players, including four attackers, four midfielders, four defenders and two goalkeepers.

RULES OF INTEREST

Athletes Unlimited Lacrosse playing rules are based on the NCAA rule book with several exceptions, including:

Field Size: The field is 100 yards long by 60 yards wide with 80 yards between the goals. In addition, the restraining line is the center line, but restraining lines will be in use for the draw. Instead of an eight-meter fan, Athletes Unlimited Lacrosse will use an eight-meter "key."

Timing: Four 10-minute (10:00) stopped time quarters will be played during a regulation game with a 60-second shot clock in play. There will be a three-minute (3:00) break between the first and second quarters and third and fourth quarters. Halftime will be 15 minutes in length.

Shot Clock Reset: The 60-second shot clock will reset if a shot attempt is a goal, saved by the goalkeeper or hits the crossbar or the goal post.

Timeouts: Each team is permitted to take one timeout per quarter, but timeouts do not carry over if unused. If a team does not take a timeout before the five-minute mark of the quarter, a media timeout will be called at the next dead ball situation. The first timeout of any quarter (media or team-called) will be three minutes (3:00) in length and any subsequent timeouts in the period will be one minute (1:00) in length.

Overtime and Shootouts: In the event a game is tied at the end of regulation, a three-minute overtime period will be played following a one-minute break. If the game is still tied, a shootout will take place with teams alternating three rounds of attempts. If the shootout remains tied after three rounds, it will move into a sudden-victory format with each team alternating one shot in each subsequent round.

Foul Changes: No shooting space fouls will be called, but a dangerous shot foul can still be issued. If a shot attempt hits a player from the knee and above, a red card will be administered. In addition, defenders cannot intentionally enter the shooting space with the intent of blocking a shot, or position multiple defenders in front of the goal (walling). No three-second defensive calls will be made and no touch fouls will be called, but players cannot be displaced.

Over and Back: Teams may not go back into the defensive half of the field once they establish possession in the offensive half. If a team violates this rule, possession is turned over to the defensive team.

Captain's Challenges: Teams will be permitted two (2) challenges per game, which are communicated to the officials via the captain or facilitator. The following situations may be challenged:

- » Goals
- » Two-Point Goals
- » Whether the ball was out of the crosse when time expires in a period
- » Dangerous Shots
- » False Starts

Teams **DO NOT** retain their challenges if they are successful. The Challenge Official makes the final decision on all challenges.

Scoring: Teams may score a two-point goal if the shot is released outside the eight-meter key. In addition, goalkeepers can score with a goalkeeper crosse during game play (regulation and overtime).

INDIVIDUAL LEADERBOARD

While traditional lacrosse statistics are compiled during each game, players earn individual points by accumulating those statistics. Those points are used to create an individual leaderboard, which determines captains for each week and the individual champion at the end of the season.

Points are awarded at the following increments during the game:

If a game goes into overtime or a shootout, the stats accumulated during the extra period or shootout do not earn any individual points for the athletes on the leaderboard.

In addition, athletes will be awarded 20 individual points if their team wins a single quarter. If the teams score the same number of points (goals + two-point goals) in a quarter, the points carry over to the next quarter. Athletes on the winning team in each game will be awarded 45 individual points.

A total of three MVPs will be selected following each game by the athletes with the top player earning 45 points. The second MVP receives 30 points, while the third MVP claims 15 points.

POSTSEASON AWARDS

At the conclusion of the 2023 Athletes Unlimited Lacrosse season, medals will be presented to the top four finishers on the leaderboard in addition to the Defensive Player of the Year and the Teammate of the Year presented by weThink. An All-Defensive Team will also be recognized as part of the closing ceremony.

ATHLETE COMPENSATION

Athletes are compensated in three ways during an Athletes Unlimited season, including base pay, win bonuses (quarter and game wins) and a leaderboard bonus. The leaderboard bonus also includes an additional donation equal to 100 percent of the athlete's win bonus to their selected cause partner.

MEDALS

The top four players on the final leaderboard in addition to the Defensive Player of the Year and the Teammate of the Year presented by weThink will receive a medal designed and fabricated for Athletes Unlimited by Lisa Issenberg, founder of Kiitellä, inc. The front face of the media represents the identity of Athletes Unlimited, while the back face of the medal leans into the specific sport, the year, location and words about Athletes Unlimited's vision, mission and values on and off the field - Excellence in Community and Leadership.

THE BOOK OF UNLIMITED

The Book of Unlimited was designed, handmade and bound for Athletes Unlimited. The book weighs nearly 25 pounds, measures approximately 12" by 18" and contains nearly 500 pages. The champion's name, along with the name of all athletes who competed, are inscribed into the book. In addition, The Book of Unlimited also contains a history of achievements in Athletes Unlimited, including stories, highlights and events.
