AU PRO VOLLEYBALL CHAMPIONSHIP 101

HOW THE TEAMS ARE SELECTED

A draft will be held prior to each week's matches with the top four players in the individual leaderboard serving as the team captains. The captains will then fill their rosters by selecting 10 other players. Each draft will be held on the day following the completion of the previous week's matches.

Uniform colors will be assigned based on the team captain's rank on the leaderboard. The top-scoring captain's team will wear gold, while the second-highest point scorer's team dons orange jerseys. The third-place team will wear blue jerseys and the fourth-place team will wear purple jerseys.

Each team will consist of 11 players, including five PINs (outside hitters and opposite hitters), two setters, three middle blockers and one libero.

RULES OF INTEREST

Match Duration: Each AU Pro Volleyball Championship match consists of three (3) sets regardless of whether a team wins two sets in the match. A set is won when a team scores 25 or more points while winning by a margin of two (2) points or more.

Golden Set: In the event the match score is tied after three (3) sets, a "Golden Set" will be played to determine the match winner. The "golden set" will be won by the team which scores five (5) points while winning by a two-point margin or when a team reaches 10 total points.

Substitutions: Teams are limited to a maximum of six (6) substitutions in each set. In the event any match requires a "golden set," teams will be permitted no more than two (2) substitutions for the additional set.

Timeouts: Each team is permitted a maximum of two (2) timeouts per set. The first timeout in any set will last three minutes (3:00), while any subsequent timeouts will be one minute (1:00) in length. In the event any match requires a "golden set," each team will be given one (1) timeout for the additional set.

Media Timeouts: If neither team has called a timeout prior to one team scoring 15 points in a set, a media timeout of three minutes (3:00) will be called.

Time Between Sets: A timeout of four minutes (4:00) will take place between each set.

Captain's Challenges: A captain may initiate replay review of certain events subject to the provisions of the rule as set out below. Replay reviews triggered under this rule shall be referred to as a 'Captain's Challenge', or 'Challenge' for short.

Each team is entitled to two (2) challenges per set. If a "Golden Set" is required, each team will be granted one (1) challenge.

A team may use a Challenge to initiate replay review of the following events:

- » Whether a ball is in or out
» Block touch
» Service line fault
» 3-meter line fault
» Center line fault
» Net touch

Any called fault, violation, or other decision by the match officials not listed above, or any non-call, is not a challengeable event.

INDIVIDUAL LEADERBOARD

While traditional volleyball statistics are kept during each AU Pro Volleyball Championship match, players earn individual points by accumulating those statistics. Points accumulated by statistics, set and/or match victories and Match MVP selections are used to create an individual leaderboard, which determines the captains for each week in addition to the individual champion at the end of the season.

Points are awarded at the following increments during the match:

Table with 2 columns: Statistic and Points. Includes Service Ace (+12), Block (+12), Kill (+8), Dig (+5), Good Pass (+2), Block Assist (+2), Assist (+1), Service Error (-8), Attack Error (-12), Set Error (-12), Pass Error (-12).

* - Middle blockers only

If a match requires overtime or a "Golden Set," the stats accumulated during the "Golden Set" do not earn any individual points for the athletes on the leaderboard. In addition, there are no additional team set win points for the "Golden Set."

In addition, athletes will be awarded 40 individual points if their team wins a single set.

Athletes on the winning team in each match will be awarded 60 individual points toward the individual leaderboard. The total score determines the overall match winner, which means a team may lose two sets, but win the overall match.

Example: The Gold Team loses the first two sets 25-23 and 25-23 to the Blue Team, but wins the last set, 25-17. The Gold Team wins the overall match points because they had the larger overall score, 71-67.

A total of three MVPs will be selected following each game by the athletes with the top player earning 60 points. The second MVP receives 40 points, while the third MVP claims 20 points.

MEDALS

The top four players on the final leaderboard in addition to the Defensive Player of the Year, Blocker of the Year and Teammate of the Year will receive a medal designed and fabricated for Athletes Unlimited by Lisa Issenberg, founder of Kiitellä, inc. The front face of the medal represents the identity of Athletes Unlimited, while the back face of the medal leans into the specific sport, the year, location and words about Athletes Unlimited's vision, mission and values on and off the field - Excellence in Community and Leadership.

ATHLETE COMPENSATION

Athletes are compensated in three ways during an AU Pro Volleyball Championship season, including base pay, win bonuses (set and match wins) and a leaderboard bonus. Athletes Unlimited also makes an additional donation equal to the athlete's win bonus to their selected cause partner.

POSTSEASON AWARDS

At the conclusion of the 2025 AU Pro Volleyball Championship, the following awards will be presented during the closing ceremony:

- » Medals to top four finishers on leaderboard
» Defensive Player of the Year
» Blocker of the Year
» Teammate of the Year
» AU Pro Volleyball Championship All-Position Team (top players at each position)

The All-Position Team includes one setter, one libero, one opposite hitter, two middle blockers and two outside hitters.

THE BOOK OF UNLIMITED

The Book of Unlimited was designed, handmade and bound for Athletes Unlimited. The book weighs nearly 25 pounds, measures approximately 12" by 18" and contains nearly 500 pages. The champion, along with all who competed, are inscribed into the book. In addition, The Book of Unlimited also contains a history of achievements in Athletes Unlimited, including stories, highlights and events.

The book is opened during the Opening Ceremony for each season and is closed after the champion is named and her name is inscribed into the book. The tradition started in 2020 during Athletes Unlimited Pro Softball's inaugural season.

LIBERTY FIRST CREDIT UNION ARENA

Athletes Unlimited Seasons Hosted:

2025 AU Pro Volleyball Championship

Formerly known as Ralson Arena, the Liberty First Credit Union Arena welcomed the AU Pro Volleyball Championship for the first half of the 2025 season.

The venue, located just outside of Omaha, currently serves as the home of the Omaha Lancers of the United States Hockey League and the Omaha Beef football team of the National Arena League. The University of Nebraska-Omaha men's basketball program previously used Liberty First Credit Union Arena as its home court until 2015.

Most recently, Liberty First Credit Union Arena was the home facility for the LOVB Omaha squad during the inaugural 2025 League One Volleyball season.

The 17,000-square foot arena holds a capacity crowd of over 4,000 fans and features up to six dressing room areas. The facility also boasts a banquet hall space that holds banquets, weddings, receptions and trade shows in addition to other events.



VETERANS MEMORIAL COLISEUM AT THE ALLIANT ENERGY CENTER

Athletes Unlimited Seasons Hosted:

2025 AU Pro Volleyball Championship

The Veterans Memorial Coliseum at the Alliant Energy Center in Madison, Wis., served as a host site for the final two weeks of the 2025 AU Pro Volleyball Championship season.

Built in 1967, the coliseum features seating for over 10,000 fans and highlights the Alliant Energy Center campus. The venue has hosted concerts, sporting events, consumer shows, conventions and more.

Completely renovated in the mid-2000s, the facility showcases an LED video scoreboard, updated suites, locker rooms and lobbies, nine dressing rooms, concession stands and full box office services.

Veterans Memorial Coliseum at the Alliant Energy Center was a home site for LOVB Madison in the inaugural League One Volleyball season in 2025. Prior to LOVB Madison calling the venue home, the facility acted as the home site for the Wisconsin Badgers men's hockey team for 30 years and stood as the one of the largest college hockey venues in the nation. The university's women's hockey program also played at the Coliseum during its first two seasons between 1999-2001. The facility has welcomed the Wisconsin Interscholastic Athletic Association boys' and girls' state hockey tournament each year since 2001.

Several other professional teams have called the Veterans Memorial Coliseum home, including the Madison Monsters (1995-99), Madison Kodiaks (1999-2000) and the Madison Mad Dogs and Wisconsin Wolfpack indoor football teams.

Veterans Memorial Coliseum stands as the center piece of the Alliant Energy Center, which also features an exhibition hall, an outdoor event venue for festivals (Willow Island), concerts, corporate gatherings and New Holland Pavilions, the latest addition to the campus, which added nearly 300,000 square feet of agricultural show space.




COACH BIOS

Alisha Childress guided her teams to a 7-5 combined record in her first season as an AU Pro Volleyball Championship coach.

COACH • SECOND SEASON

KAYLA BANWARTH



Kayla Banwarth returns as a coach for the 2025 Athletes Unlimited Pro Volleyball Championship after serving in the same role during the 2023 campaign.

Banwarth posted an 8-7 record as a facilitator during her debut with the league in 2023.

Banwarth served as the head coach for the Atlanta Vibe during the 2025 Pro Volleyball Federation season. She garnered PVF Coach of the Year laurels after guiding the team to a 19-9 regular season mark, including a league-record 13-match winning streak. The Vibe advanced to their second straight PVF Championship appearance before falling to the Orlando Valkyries in the semifinals.

Under Banwarth's tutelage, four Vibe players were named to the 2025 PVF All-League teams, including AU Pro Volleyball veteran Morgan Hentz, who was named as the league's Libero of the Year. Middle blocker Khorri Louis also collected the PVF's Rising Star Award.

Banwarth, a 2012 graduate of Nebraska, spent three seasons as the head volleyball coach at Ole Miss from 2020-22. Under her guidance, the Rebels secured their first NCAA Tournament appearance in 11 years after earning an at-large berth into the 2021 event.

Ole Miss also registered the best turnaround in NCAA Division I in 2021, fashioning a 21-9 record after winning just one match in 2020-21. Three players on the 2021 squad – Anna Bair, Kylie McLaughlin and Sasha Ratliff – earned AVCA South All-Region recognition, while McLaughlin and Ratliff garnered a spot on the All-Southeastern Conference Team.

Prior to being named the eighth head coach in Ole Miss history, Banwarth spent three seasons as an assistant coach at her alma mater. The Huskers won the 2017 NCAA Division I title and made an appearance in the national championship match in 2018.

During Banwarth's first season on the Husker sidelines, Nebraska claimed the NCAA crown after compiling a 32-4 record, including a 19-1 mark in Big Ten Conference play. Setter Kelly Hunter was named co-recipient of the NCAA Championship's Most Outstanding Player award in addition to being a First-Team AVCA All-America pick and the Big Ten's Setter of the Year.

In 2018, the Huskers returned to the NCAA Championship match and ranked as one of the best defensive units in the nation after limiting opponents to a .144 hitting percentage. Libero Kenzie Maloney earned her second consecutive NCAA Championship All-Tournament Team honor in addition to receiving Third-Team AVCA All-America distinction.

Banwarth's final season at her alma mater culminated in the Huskers ranking ninth in the nation with a .153 opponent hitting percentage and reaching the NCAA quarterfinals for the eighth consecutive season.

Before returning to Lincoln, Banwarth was a volunteer assistant coach for the men's volleyball team at Pepperdine in 2015 and 2016. The Waves went 13-11 in her first season while the squad ranked among the nation's leaders by averaging 7.69 digs per set.

Banwarth, a former walk-on at Nebraska, became the starting libero midway through her freshman season and held the starting role until 2010. She was an Honorable Mention All-Big 12 Conference selection as a junior and senior while leading the Huskers to three Big 12 Conference titles in addition to an appearance in the 2008 NCAA semifinals.

Banwarth holds the Nebraska single-match record with 32 digs in a three-set affair against Baylor on November 18, 2009, and stands as one of four players in program history to notch 30 or more digs in a match. She also ranks second on the Huskers' single-season and career charts after accumulating 1,706 digs from 2007-10, including 570 digs during her junior year.

Banwarth embarked on a professional playing career in 2011 that featured six years on the United States National Team. She also played professionally overseas in Azerbaijan.

Banwarth was named the Best Receiver at the 2015 NORCECA Championship and helped Team USA win a Gold medal at the FIVB World Grand Prix in 2016. She also aided Team USA to the FIVB World Championship in 2014, the first Gold medal for the United States at a major tournament.

Banwarth anchored the squad at the 2016 Olympic Games in Rio De Janeiro, helping Team USA earn a Bronze medal.

Banwarth was named USA Volleyball's Female Indoor Most Improved Player of the Year in 2013 and led the team to a Gold medal at the 2012 and 2013 Pan American Cups. She was the runner-up in the Best Digger category at the 2013 FIVB World Grand Champions Cup after posting 3.19 digs per set.

Banwarth started her international playing career in 2011 by piloting Team USA to a Bronze medal at the Pan American Games.

A native of Dubuque, Iowa, Banwarth earned her bachelor's degree in English from Nebraska in 2012.



COACH • FIRST SEASON

ALISHA CHILDRESS



After a three-year career as an Athletes Unlimited player and a professional career that expanded over the last decade, Alisha Childress embarks on her first stint as a coach for the 2025 AU Pro Volleyball Championship campaign.

One of four setters in AU Pro Volleyball history to accumulate 1,000 or more career assists, the former Player Executive Committee member ranks second in league history with 1,167 assists while standing second on the all-time chart by recording 30 or more assists in 25 career contests. She also sits 10th on the league's list with 302 career digs.

Childress enjoyed her best AU Pro Volleyball season in 2024 after placing 15th in the final standings with a career-high 2,426 leaderboard points. She ranked third in the circuit with 360 assists while adding 93 digs with 13 solo blocks.

Childress, who posted 200 or more leaderboard points in a match five times, tallied at least 20 assists in each of her final nine contests, including eight matches with 30 or more assists. She dished out a season-high 40 assists and contributed 10 digs in her first start of the season against Team Drews on October 18 to claim MVP 3 status.

The 2023 AU Pro Volleyball campaign saw Childress register 1,979 leaderboard points after appearing in all 15 matches. She ranked third in the league with 433 assists, including a league-best six matches with 40 or more helpers. Childress set an AU Pro Volleyball record by opening the season with four straight matches with at least 40 assists, including a career-high 43 assists during the first week of the campaign.

Childress debuted with AU Pro Volleyball in 2022 and registered 2,293 leaderboard points after completing the year with 374 assists, the third-highest total in the circuit.

Outside of Athletes Unlimited, Childress was a member of the Vegas Thrill for two seasons of the Pro Volleyball Federation (now Major League Volleyball). She ranked second in the league with 956 assists over 92 sets in 2024 and earned the league's Most Inspirational Player of the Year award in 2025.

Childress, who was named the head coach of the San Diego Mojo on August 9, 2025, began her coaching career as an assistant coach for the United States National Team at the 2018 Pan American Cup, leading Team USA to a Gold medal over the host Dominican Republic. She then entered the college ranks and served as an assistant coach at Stanford from 2019-20, helping the Cardinal claim the 2019 NCAA Division I National Championship.

Regarded as one of the top setters in the world during her playing career, Childress also boasts professional experience in Italy, Turkey, Poland, Puerto Rico and Brazil, and was a long-time member of the United States National Team. A 2016 Olympic Bronze medalist with Team USA, Childress spent six years piloting the national team's offense from 2010-16. She was named USA Volleyball Indoor Athlete of the Year two times in 2013 and 2014 in addition to Best Setter honors across five different competitions. Childress also guided Team USA to Gold medals at the FIVB World Grand Prix Finals three times (2010-12) and at the 2024 FIVB World Championships.

Childress played collegiately at Penn State under legendary head coach Russ Rose. The Nittany Lions claimed three national titles from 2007-09 while compiling an impressive 110-2 record. Childress garnered AVCA All-America laurels three times and was also selected to the NCAA Championship All-Tournament Team each of her last three seasons. She was also nominated for the 2009 Honda Award.

In her career at Penn State, Childress ranked among program leaders with 5,800 career assists and also tallied 398 kills, 926 digs and 454 blocks. She set the school's three-set single-match record with 48 assists and also placed herself second on the program's single-season chart with 1,452 assists in 2009.

Childress is married to Josh Childress and has three children. She majored in kinesiology with a minor in human development and family studies while at Penn State.



COACH • FIRST SEASON

FERNANDO MORALES



Fernando Morales brings a wealth of volleyball experience as a player and a coach as he embarks on his first season as an Athletes Unlimited Pro Volleyball Championship coach in 2025.

Morales has served as the head coach of the South Korean Women's National Team since 2024 and also sits at the helm of the Mets de Guaynabo men's club in the Puerto Rican league where he claimed Coach of the Year honors this past season.

Prior to his time in South Korea, Morales guided the Puerto Rican Women's National Team from 2020-24 after serving as an assistant coach for one year. He led the squad to Bronze medals at the 2022 Challenger Cup and the 2022 NORCECA Pan-American Cup Final Six. The squad also finished as the runner up in the 2023 Pan-American Cup after consecutive sixth-place results in the competition's previous two events.

In the United States, Morales spent six seasons as the women's volleyball head coach at the University of Evansville, which is a member of the Missouri Valley Conference. He guided the Purple Aces to 76 victories during his tenure, including a 21-12 record in the fall 2021 season where Evansville saw its first 20-win campaign since 1988. The Purple Aces went on to qualify for the 2021 National Invitational Volleyball Championship, which was the program's first postseason tournament since the early 1980s.

Under his tutelage, Morales mentored Giulia Cardona, who became the program's first AVCA All-America selection after claiming a spot on the honorable mention list in 2023. Cardona was also recognized as the 2023 Missouri Valley Conference Player of the Year along with earning a pair of AVCA All-Region certificates. She was a four-time All-MVC honoree who garnered First-Team status in each of her final three seasons.

Morales joined the Evansville staff in 2018 as an assistant coach before assuming interim head coaching duties for the 2019 campaign. As the Aces' interim head coach, he guided the program to its first winning record since 2010 and the team's first conference tournament berth since 2008. Morales was named to the Volleyballmag.com Under 40 Coaching Hot-shots list after the 2023 season.

Morales played professionally for 14 years in Puerto Rico, Spain, Austria, Cyprus, Russia, Lebanon and Greece. He was a three-time champion in the Puerto Rican league where he claimed Best Setter honors four times, including three straight selections from 2008-10. Morales was also the league's MVP in 2008 and was named as the circuit's Best Server in 2008 and 2010.

A member of the Puerto Rican National Team from 2001-14 as a setter, Morales claimed three Silver medals with the squad, including the 2008 Olympic Qualifier and 2007 Pan-American Cup. Morales claimed Best Setter distinction at the 2009 and 2007 Pan-American Cups in Mexico and Dominican Republic, respectively. He also piloted the team to a Bronze medal at the 2010 Pan-American Cup that was hosted by Puerto Rico.

During his time with the Puerto Rico Junior National Team, Morales claimed Best Setter Junior status at the 2000 NORCECA competition in Cuba and guided the team to a World Championship qualifier in 2001.

In addition to his extensive resume with indoor volleyball, Morales was the 2005 University League champion in beach volleyball along with a pair of second place finishes in 2000 and 2004.

A native of San Juan, Puerto Rico, Morales comes from an athletic family as the son of Mario Morales, who is one of the best players in the Baloncesto Superior Nacional league history, and Maria Lopez, who was also a volleyball standout.



COACH • FOURTH SEASON

JOE TRINSEY



After serving as a coach during three of the first four Athletes Unlimited Pro Volleyball seasons, Joe Trinsey makes his return to the league for the 2025 campaign.

Trinsey paced all coaches with an 11-4 record during the inaugural 2021 season before compiling a 7-8 mark over five weeks in 2022. He closed out the 2024 campaign with an 8-7 record and leads all AU Pro Volleyball coaches in career matches (45) and victories (26).

With coaching stops across many levels of volleyball, Trinsey most recently served as the head coach of the Gwangju Pepper Savings Bank Al Peppers women's team in the Korean Volleyball Federation. He also spent 2022 as an assistant coach for the Canadian National Team after serving as a coach for the 2021 and 2022 AU Pro Volleyball seasons.

Most notably, Trinsey worked with the United States National Team from 2013-20 and was an assistant coach for the women's team when it claimed its first world championship Gold medal at the 2014 FIVB World Championship in Milan, Italy. He also guided the United States to a Bronze medal at the 2016 Rio Olympics and was the head coach for the 2017 World University Games and 2021 NORCECA Championship teams.

In addition to his time with Team USA, Trinsey served as an assistant coach at several NCAA programs, including Loyola Marymount, Pepperdine, Georgia, and BYU. He also coached Duren Powervolleys in the first division of the German League.

Trinsey, a native of Wilmington, Del., has been heavily involved in the club level of youth volleyball, including a head coaching stint with the Brandywine Volleyball Club. He guided his U-15 team to a qualification in the USA Volleyball Girls' Junior National Championships in 2009-10 and guided the U-17 team to the tournament in 2010-11.

An outside hitter at the Stevens Institute of Technology from 2006-09, Trinsey compiled 1,180 kills during his four seasons and claimed First-Team AVCA All-America status as a senior after finishing with a .356 hitting percentage, 368 kills, 187 digs and 102 total blocks. The Ducks advanced to the 2009 Molten Division III Volleyball Championship and ended the year as the national runner-up.

A 2009 graduate of Stevens Institute, Trinsey holds a degree in applied mathematics.



PLAYER DEVELOPMENT COACH • FIRST SEASON

BEAU LAWLER



Beau Lawler enters his first Athletes Unlimited Pro Volleyball Championship season as he leads the league's player development efforts in addition to serving as the assistant director of sport during the 2025 campaign.

A veteran volleyball coach with experience at multiple levels of the sport, Lawler returned to the bench for Blue Mountain Christian's women's volleyball team as the associate head coach in 2024. The Toppers finished with a 22-8 record and advanced to the league tournament championship match.

Lawler also served as an assistant coach at BMC for the 2022 season, mentoring the squad to a 34-3 record and the first round of the NAIA National Tournament while being recognized as the AVCA Northeast Region Assistant Coach of the Year.

Lawler owns a plethora of NCAA Division I experience at Utah, Ole Miss, Idaho State and Nebraska.

Utah made major strides during Lawler's three seasons as the data and video coordinator. The Utes rose from a 10th place standing in the Pac-12 Conference in 2015 to securing a berth in the NCAA Tournament and advancing to the third round in 2017.

Lawler was a member of Kayla Banwarth's staff at Ole Miss from 2019-21 and guided the Rebels to a 21-9 record in 2021 along with their first NCAA Tournament appearance since 2010. Lawler's coaching helped the squad to a 20-win improvement over the previous season.

After arriving at Idaho State in 2018, the Bengals made an eight-match improvement in their record from the previous campaign. He went on to work at Nebraska as the Huskers' assistant director of operations, guiding all aspects of coordinating game film and data.

Outside of the college ranks, Lawler coached Club V at the club volleyball level as a head coach and assistant coach for numerous teams. He totaled 14 players who went on to play at the collegiate level and qualified seven teams for the USAV Girls Junior National Championships in 2018. In addition, Lawler was named AVCA National Club Coach of the Year in the girls U-17 division with the Arizona Sky in 2023 and double-qualified teams for nationals in the open division, finishing 29th in the nation.

Lawler was involved with the USA Volleyball Women's National Team from 2016-22 where he helped evaluate and analyze the team's high-performance tryouts and was a court coach for open tryouts.

Lawler played soccer for two seasons at Palomar College before finishing his bachelor's degree in mathematics and statistics at Utah in 2018.

WHY TWO-TIME OLYMPIAN JORDAN THOMPSON CHOSE ATHLETES UNLIMITED AS THE NEXT STEP OF HER CAREER

To reach the top of one's professional field just one year after finishing college would be quite a lofty dream for most, but for two-time U.S. Olympian Jordan Thompson, that accomplishment became a reality when she helped claim the very first Olympic gold medal for the US women's national volleyball team in 2021.

But once you've reached the top, where do you go from there?

Now, four years after her gold medal-worthy Olympic debut, Thompson is coming off the most time off she's had since beginning to play sports as a child. Her next step after a months-long hiatus? She's joining a pool of 40 elite volleyball players in a competition that will crown one winner as the best of the best: the Athletes Unlimited Pro Volleyball Championship.

Thompson's post-Olympics journey has been about redefining what success looks like in her career, and has given her the freedom to reshape her decision-making process and chase new challenges.

The question of "where to next?" is something the 6-foot-4 opposite hitter asked herself following her first Olympics.

"We just literally made history. Why do I feel so weird after? I mean, it feels like the pinnacle of your career, you just accomplished the biggest thing that there is to accomplish in your sport, and you're kind of like, 'Okay, well, what do I do now?'" she recalled.

The Cincinnati alum returned to Paris to claim silver in 2024 after stacking accolade after accolade with Team USA during international competitions, but found herself experiencing what she describes as "post-Olympic blues."

Between those two Olympic appearances, Thompson's resume continued growing. She battled through an injury that limited her Tokyo experience, making her primary goal for Paris simply being fully healthy. Mission accomplished—but that silver medal finish still left her questioning what came next.

The volleyball landscape around Thompson was simultaneously transforming. During her peak years with the national team, opportunities to play professionally on U.S. soil exploded. Thompson became one of the faces of League One Volleyball (LOVB), playing in its inaugural season with LOVB Houston, where she earned 2025 LOVB Opposite Hitter of the Year honors and LOVB Icons Second Team recognition.

Following the LOVB season, she ventured to Indonesia's Proliga with Jakarta Pertamina Enduro, where she embraced a completely different style of play that challenged her in unexpected ways.

"The girls just have so much fun playing, and they're so joyful," Thompson said. "It brought me back to how I felt as a new player in volleyball, just learning the sport, in the sense of like there was just this pure joy and love and appreciation for getting to play.

That Indonesian experience became a turning point. Thompson realized she'd been missing something fundamental: the simple joy of competition.

For the first time in her professional career, Thompson took a true break with her first summer off from national team duties in four years.

"I had the chance to miss it," she explained. "I was watching volleyball on TV, and I realized, like, 'Oh my gosh. I miss competing, I miss being with my friends, I miss the huddles. I miss the feeling of winning drills in practice and winning games.'"

That realization reshaped Thompson's approach to career decisions. Rather than chasing the next major international competition or focusing solely on Olympic cycles, she began prioritizing experiences that would reignite her love for volleyball.

"I've been to two Olympics, and I've done a lot of things in volleyball, and I really just want to enjoy my time playing and have fun and play with people that I love," she said. "What's the motivation for me now? What is my why?"

Athletes Unlimited emerged as the perfect answer to that question. Scheduling conflicts with overseas commitments and national team obligations prevented her participation in previous seasons. This time, with a clearer sense of what she valued, the timing finally aligned.

"It's something I've been wanting to do for the past few years, and so to finally have everything fall into place, it was just like a no-brainer for me," she explained.

The AU format appeals to Thompson on multiple levels. The athlete-centered approach aligns with her evolved priorities, while the competitive structure offers something entirely new to tackle. As someone who describes herself as "very team-focused," the individual point system and weekly team drafts present an intriguing challenge.

"It's definitely going to be a new format compared to anything I've experienced before, but anything new is just exciting and something else to tackle," Thompson said.

More importantly, AU offers the opportunity to compete alongside players she hasn't shared the court with in years, including former collegiate national team teammate Kaz Brown, whom she hasn't played with since 2017.

The international component particularly excites Thompson. The championship field includes players from several countries, such as Brazil and Thailand, providing an opportunity for continued learning, which fits perfectly with her redefined success metrics.

"I never want to feel like I've completed my game, or I'm satisfied with where I am," she said. "To have the opportunity to continue learning from different players from different countries is something that I really value."

Thompson's decision-making process now centers on growth, enjoyment, and meaningful competition rather than external validation or traditional career milestones. At 28, she's embracing what she calls "fine-tuning".

"I don't know that I'll see the leaps and bounds that I saw when I was younger, so I think it's more about the fine-tuning and just the joy along the way," Thompson said.

For Thompson, Athletes Unlimited represents more than just another competition; it's a manifestation of her evolved relationship with volleyball. After reaching the sport's highest peaks, she's discovered that the most fulfilling path forward is about challenging herself in new ways while maintaining the joy she found in the game when she first started.

"How much can I enjoy the process and the journey?" Thompson asks herself. By joining Athletes Unlimited, she aims to do just that.



IN HER COACHING ERA: ALISHA GLASS CHILDRESS ON HER NEW ROLE IN AU PRO VOLLEYBALL

If you ask any of the 44 Athletes Unlimited Pro Volleyball stars who have shared the court with Alisha Glass Childress about their experience with the Olympic setter, they'll sing her praises. And while they won't have the chance to play alongside her this year, they will still feel her influence in Omaha and Madison this fall.

Three years ago, she came out of retirement to play in AU, and the years have been highlighted by an AU record-setting 1,167 assists, a league eighth-best 11 double-doubles, and a league tenth-best 302 career digs. Now, after the conclusion of her third AU campaign, Glass Childress has transitioned into a coaching role for the 2025 Championship season.

"I think this whole process has felt like the right move," she said.

Glass Childress has already left her mark on players from the sidelines. Five of this year's competitors have played under her during previous coaching stints: Morgan Hentz (Stanford, 2019) and McKenna Vicini (Stanford, 2019–20), when she helped the Cardinals to a national championship, plus Molly McCage, Sarah Wilhite-Parsons, and Justine Wong-Orantes, who were part of the 2018 Pan American Cup gold medal-winning U.S. squad.

And those aren't her only ties. Teammates from her decade-long playing career know her as a steady voice of reason and an insightful advisor when it comes to making adjustments and game-time decisions. Now, instead of balancing both roles, she'll be fully focused on coaching.

"I felt like I was half playing, half coaching. Sharing things that I see, offering technical or strategic adjustments," she explained. "So it feels, in some ways, very natural to now move into this space."

AU's unique format puts the top four players each week in the captain's chair to draft their own teams, but they aren't left to navigate the responsibilities alone. Four coaches work alongside them throughout the season, pairing up with one captain each week, and offering their perspectives and strategies. Glass Childress brings something unique to that group: the experience of having competed in AU as recently as last season.

"Having played so recently, I really know exactly what they're feeling," she said. "When you're coming from that place, it can create an instant connection, or an instant relationship-builder, or trust."

Her career pivot isn't confined to AU. After two seasons playing for the Pro Volleyball Federation/Major League Volleyball's Vegas Thrill, where she earned All-Position Team honors in 2024 and a place in the league's All-Star match in 2025, Glass Childress will take on her first professional head coaching position with the San Diego Mojo in 2026. And some of the players on her Mojo roster are among the stars competing for the AU crown this fall.

Kayla Caffey, Marlie Moserez, Carly Graham, and Taylor Sandbothe will get their first taste of Glass Childress in an official coaching capacity before playing under her in San Diego. New Mojo signee Vicini will have a familiar coaching voice during the AU season before heading into her first MLV campaign.

"I think San Diego is a really good opportunity to build something," she said. "The organization and the community see the vision of what it can be to have a professional volleyball team in California, which has such a rich volleyball history."

Her very first AU coaching assignment is fitting, as she's been paired with another fixture in AU Pro Volleyball: Outside hitter Bethania De La Cruz-Mejía.

De La Cruz-Mejía has served as a captain 15 times, the most by any athlete across all AU sports. As she enters her 16th week of captaincy, she's grateful for the chance to collaborate with Glass Childress.

"I feel so good with her," Cruz-Mejía said of their pairing. "She's so smart, and she really knows everything about the game. As a setter, she needed to know and see the game better than hitters do, so I'm so happy to work with her the first week. In the draft, she helped me a lot."

Glass Childress credits all the coaches she's worked with during her career for molding her playing and coaching philosophy into what it is today.

"I think every coach that I've had has an impact on how I am going to coach, or how I coach now," she explained. "I think there's just a little piece of each and every one of them, whether it's the competitive drive, or the way that they plan practice, the way that they treat their athletes and build relationships."

As she steps into this new phase, Glass Childress joins the wave of athlete-turned-coaches across AU pro sports. Whether in Omaha, Madison, or soon San Diego, her influence continues to spread across the pro game as she helps shape its future.



HOW HEYDI CASANOVA CLAIMED HER FREEDOM THROUGH VOLLEYBALL

Heydi Casanova is a traitor.

At least, that's how she's been branded by the communist state of Cuba. The reason for this searing label? Casanova dared to protest the mistreatment and exploitation she and her teammates suffered while playing for the Cuban National Volleyball Team.

She's since defected from the federation, but her relationship with the sport remains untainted as she navigates new playing opportunities abroad and stands firm in her stance against her home country's dictatorship.

It's been eight years since Casanova fled Cuba, and the choice has come with challenges. Still, when asked about her decision, her answer will always be the same.

"I don't have any doubts about what I did. If you gave me one more chance, I would do it again."

And she isn't alone in her act of defiance. When she and teammate Lisset Herrera slipped away from their team in a Slovenian airport—one of the few places the state-sponsored athletes were allowed possession of their own passports—while returning from the U23 World Championships, they joined the hundreds of Cuban athletes who have taken that same chance.

But before the now decorated opposite hitter reached her breaking point under the National Team's harsh regulations, defecting was something she never considered.

Her volleyball journey began at 12 years old, when she immediately took to the sport, despite never having played or even watched a match. Her rapid improvement, above-average height, and a family connection led to her entry into Cuba's Escuelas de Iniciación Deportiva, an intensive sports initiation school designed for scouting and molding future national team players.

Casanova was captivated by the sport, and in the highly competitive sports academy, making the national team quickly became her sole focus. After just one year, she was called up for her first competition with the U20 squad. At 13 years old, her competitive drive intensified as she competed for a spot in the lineup with teammates up to seven years her senior.

She started as a middle blocker, and although her lack of experience meant she bore the brunt of in-practice punishments and extra conditioning assignments, the high-pressure environment didn't dim her excitement. The value of the opportunity wasn't lost on her, and she was determined to earn her place on the team.

Casanova laughs when she recalls the intensity of her youthful competitiveness.

"I always had the oldest players over me, so I was laughing in practices or off of the court, but when they put me in to play, I was like, dead face, and like, 'I'm going to kill you because I want my place.'"

Now 26 years old, Casanova can pinpoint the exact moment she felt that something was amiss with the National Team environment she was raised in.

During the 2015 Pan American Games in Toronto, Canada, one of her teammates ran from the team.

"As a kid, I was like, 'Okay, the situation of the country is not the best, but I think I can be good here.'" Casanova said. "My family was really close, so I never thought about leaving. But after that girl ran away, it changed my point of view."

As she flew up the ranks of the national team and quickly became known as one of the country's most promising rising stars, her disillusionment with the system progressed.

While her on-court success continued to make money for the Cuban Government, she didn't see a cent of her winnings outside of occasional extra meal money. The national team kept her clothed, housed, and fed, but she had no freedom to make personal purchases. Casanova was given no more than the bare necessities, and she and her teammates resorted to trading clothing and souvenirs with opponents, selling Cuban cigars for pocket change, and were often secretly gifted gear from other national teams.

"We used to play with USA and they were really kind to us," she recounted. "They used to give us shoes, clothes, a lot of stuff. But, because of our country, we could not wear those things because it's from 'the enemy'... We'd just sell it."

As she grew older, Casanova felt the desire to provide for her family and repay them for the sacrifices they made for her volleyball career. But the \$10 she earned for the occasional box of cigars felt insufficient.

When her long-time teammate and best friend, Melissa Vargas, suffered a shoulder injury, received poor medical care, and was discarded by the federation, Casanova raised her concerns.

Vargas' mishandled medical situation was not unique, and she was later handed a four-year ban for being non-compliant with the federation's injury recovery requirements.

In an effort to slow the rising rates of defecting national team members, Cuba began to adjust its policies to allow athletes to sign contracts abroad and receive some compensation for their play. Casanova, however, had become outspoken about her mistreatment. As punishment, unbeknownst to her, she was blocked from competing outside of the country.

Meanwhile, she continued to dominate in international competitions, leading her team at the 2017 Pan-American Cup, where she tallied a Pan Am Cup record 41 points before pacing the team in the FIVB U20 and U23 World Championships.

Still, until a family friend informed her that her lack of foreign contract offers wasn't a coincidence, she was led to believe that she was unwanted by the volleyball clubs abroad.

"They were just blocking me because I was saying the truth," Casanova said. "And I said, 'That's it, I'm not gonna allow it anymore.'"

Casanova was approached by an agent who offered to get her a contract outside of Cuba, and she was faced with two choices: accept the two-year seizure of her passport as punishment for quitting the national team, or run.

Casanova weighed her options, made her plan of escape, and hasn't looked back.

Since defecting, she's played professionally in France, Brazil, Romania, China, Türkiye, and, most recently, in the United States with League One Volleyball's Salt Lake squad. In that time, she's earned quite the collection of championship hardware, including the 2021 and 2024 Romanian League titles, the 2021 Ukrainian Cup, the 2022 Ukrainian Superliga Cup, and the 2022 French Saforelle Power 6 crown and French Cup.

"My agent would ask me, 'Where would you like to play?' and I could tell him, 'I'd love to play in Brazil,' and they'd find me a contract in Brazil. I never knew it was that easy," she explained.

Casanova's first contract in the United States was with Athletes Unlimited, which was recommended to her by Turkish league teammate Tori Dixon.

She was intrigued by the unfamiliar format and jumped at the chance to compete in the 2024 AU competition. Her transition to U.S. leagues marked the start of a new chapter in her playing career, and has changed her outlook on the sport.

"I feel like now that I can just have fun and just enjoy my teammates and just make really good memories, because until now, I've been playing all for money, or just going to the country that I want to play in, just to have the feeling of what it is to be there," she said. "But at this point of my career, I just want to have fun."

Although she's flourished in the freedom she found abroad, her heart remains with her family members who remain in Cuba and every citizen who suffers as a result of the country's economic crisis.

"I still talk to [my parents]. Well, whenever the internet allows us," she explained. "When I was a kid living there, you might not have electricity for a whole day. Then you have it the next day...But now it's like, you'll maybe get electricity three hours a day there."

She hopes to serve as an inspiration for anyone struggling in the midst of Cuba's political unrest.

"The government there is killing the people. Basically, they have absolutely nothing, no food, no water, no electricity ... It's not good," she said. "I will stick with that until Cuba is free ... If I could tell any of the Cubans that have the opportunity to run, I will tell them to, or stay there, but at least raise your voice and say, 'Hey, this is wrong.'"

For Casanova, the freedom that she's found in the last seven years of her career is well worth the risk, the uncertainty, and the sacrifice etched between the lines of her volleyball résumé.

"I'm doing this because of me, because of my family ... I always keep in mind where I come from, everything that I've gone through. It's a good feeling."



PLAYING FOR ELLE: HOW TAYLOR SANDBOTHE IS HONORING HER SISTER & SHINING LIGHT ON GUILLAIN-BARRÉ SYNDROME

Every time Taylor Sandbothe steps on the volleyball court, she knows it's a privilege, and this fall in AU Pro Volleyball, she's stepping on the court with a deeply personal purpose. She's playing in support of the GBS/CIDP Foundation International in honor of her younger sister, Elle.

In 2021, while playing professionally in Germany, Elle was diagnosed with Guillain-Barré Syndrome, a rare inflammatory disorder that rapidly attacked her peripheral nervous system. The disease, which affects people across all demographics, took nearly everything from the young athlete in a matter of weeks.

"It essentially took her entire body from her, which was extremely scary," Taylor recalled. "Her being overseas, first of all, and it being in the heat of COVID, there was really no way for us to get to her."

Guillain-Barré Syndrome is characterized by rapid onset of numbness, weakness and often paralysis that ascends from the extremities toward the torso. The cause remains unknown, though roughly half of cases occur shortly after a viral or bacterial infection, and could come from something as common as the flu or food poisoning.

For Elle, the symptoms started with a static-like feeling in her hands and face. Within weeks, her central nervous system was shutting down.

"She lost the ability to walk. She lost the ability to pick up and throw things," Taylor said. "It's very common for people who are diagnosed with this. If it's setting in rapidly without getting that first onset treatment, you could be ventilated because your body needs something to help you breathe."

Elle was diagnosed within three weeks of her first symptoms and received blood protein infusions to help her body fight against its own immune system. But even with swift treatment, she spent weeks in inpatient and outpatient rehabilitation.

For Taylor, watching from across the ocean was gut wrenching.

"I felt so unbelievably at a loss," she admitted. "I was like a wreck. I was a complete mess. I didn't know what to do."

The Sandbothe sisters' careers have been intertwined since childhood. Growing up in a sports family started by two parents who were athletes at Missouri, competition was woven into their DNA. When Taylor went to Ohio State, Elle followed for her senior year. They even faced each other across the net when Elle played at Kansas State. It was a moment Taylor calls her best volleyball memory to this day.

Both sisters went on to play professionally overseas, with Taylor blazing the trail.

"I'm always pushing her to advocate for herself," Taylor said. "Especially being overseas, you're the only person who's really looking out for you in that sense."

But when Elle fell ill in a country where she didn't speak the language, during a pandemic when travel was nearly impossible, Taylor couldn't be the protective older sister she'd always been. Instead, she had to trust in the medical team in Germany, and Elle's boyfriend Ruben, who had yet to meet the Sandbothe family.

"He was able to be there for us and did a lot of things for us that we couldn't do," Taylor said. "Being a voice for her, being in a country where she doesn't speak the language... that's a luxury that all of us seriously take for granted."

Throughout the attack on her health, Elle refused to be defeated. Her nurses would write words like "power," "hope," and "love" on her transfusion vials. The family's mantra became "healing always."

"You would never have known what she was going through based off how she carried herself through all of this, because she didn't have a choice but to be brave," Taylor said. "She didn't know what the future held at that point either. This was just her being herself."

Elle had one goal above all others: getting back on the volleyball court.

"All she cared about was being a volleyball player again, even in those moments," Taylor recalled. "Being healthy is just not enough. She has to be back where she was because she wants this still so bad."

The experience fundamentally changed Taylor's perspective on her own career.

"When she was going through this, it changed a lot of the way that I view what I do and why I do it, and specifically my health and how important it is, and how much you take it for granted," she said.

Elle made a full recovery and returned to playing professionally overseas. But the lack of information about the disease, particularly for athletes, inspired Taylor to raise awareness.

Last summer, Taylor helped Elle write and submit her story to the GBS Foundation's patient portal, where survivors share their experiences.

"It was very eye opening to see her experience, and a lot of that stuff I wasn't really aware of," Taylor said. "Having that community, I think, was so important for her."

At the end of each season, Athletes Unlimited makes a grant equal to 100% of the athlete's end-of-season win bonus to the non-profit of the athlete's choice. When Taylor signed on to play with AU this fall, the choice was simple.

"There's just not a lot of information geared towards athletes that have it," Taylor explained. "Being a voice for my sister, being a voice for this community, and really just raising awareness around how these kinds of things affect athletes specifically...I think it's really incredible."

Elle is adamant that this stage of her career is no longer her comeback. She's back and better than ever, and wants to share her story with anyone else who's suffered from GBS. Taylor is determined to celebrate that determination from the AU Pro Volleyball court.

"She wants to have this connection with everyone," Taylor said. "For her to be healthy and to be in this space, I think it's something that should really be celebrated. I want to shout it from the rooftops, honestly."

Now, as Taylor competes in Madison, Wis. and Omaha, Neb. – close enough to her Lee's Summit, Missouri home for family to attend, she carries her sister's story with her every time she steps on the court. And with a new contract signed with the San Diego Mojo for the upcoming Major League Volleyball season, Taylor is entering the next chapter of her career with a renewed perspective.

"The coolest thing about me is my sister," Taylor said. "She has been able to emulate such grace and gratitude throughout her entire diagnosis that I felt so unbelievably compelled. I'm like, 'You've got to share your story'...She was just phenomenal through the entire process. And so is the [GBS] foundation."

For Taylor Sandbothe, every moment on the court is a gift. And this season, she's making sure that gift honors Elle, who fought to get back on the court herself.

**PARSONS ON REBUILDING HER GAME POSTPARTUM, NAVIGATING THE UNKNOWN, AND COMPETING AS A NEW MOM**

Sarah Wilhite Parsons has been a steady on-court presence and one of the most reliable sources of veteran experience in this fall's Athletes Unlimited Pro Volleyball Championship. But nine months ago, competing on the professional stage didn't feel realistic.

Parsons is a 10-time international medalist with Team USA, including three consecutive FIVB Volleyball Nations League titles and an alternate spot for the 2020 Tokyo Olympics. The 2016 AVCA and ESPNW National Player of the Year at Minnesota has since built an impressive overseas career spanning Italy, Germany, Brazil, Turkey, and Japan.

But after giving birth to her son Ezra via cesarean section in January, her timeline for recovery hit several roadblocks.

"When I was cleared at six weeks to resume working out, I was like, 'Great,'" she explained. "And so then I started, and I started too fast. I think any athlete could probably understand. When you get cleared from an injury, you're full speed ahead."

The reality didn't match her expectations. The C-section had impacted her core strength significantly, and her body began overcompensating in ways that created new problems. Leg and hip issues arose, making simple movements, like getting in and out of the car, painful. She couldn't lift her legs without effort.

"I've been injured many times, but nothing quite like this," she said. "There was a point where I was like, 'Am I ever going to feel better?' Because there were just certain things that I just couldn't do that I've never had to deal with before."

She backtracked and started physical therapy twice a week for two months. The exhaustion from sleepless nights with a newborn only intensified the frustration caused by a body that wouldn't cooperate.

"There were a lot of days where I was struggling and just didn't know if I would get there," she admitted. "Living in that kind of unknown is hard."

But Parsons had navigated uncertainty before. She had her fair share of ups and downs during her collegiate career at Minnesota before she broke out as a senior, averaging a conference-leading 4.20 kills per set and leading the Gophers to the national semifinals.

She described her younger self as having a "perfectionist mindset," and credits off-court personal development as an avenue that led to her on-court breakthrough.

Volunteer work became an outlet, and it was while volunteering at Athletes in Action's Ultimate Training summer camp that she met her husband, Jameson. Growing in her faith and establishing an identity outside of volleyball helped her overcome the challenges of sport.

Her professional career overseas prepared her for uncertainty in different ways. From joining one of the world's top leagues in Italy right after graduating with Unet E-Work Busto Arsizio, to claiming a German Bundesliga title with Allianz MTV Stuttgart, and helping Japan's NEC Red Rockets to the SV.League and Empress' Cup Championships, Parsons learned to adapt to different leagues, cultures, and situations where she never quite knew what came next, all while living an ocean away from her loved ones.

That period of Parsons' career equipped her with mental strategies that have served her well throughout her postpartum journey.

"I feel like we live a lot of times internationally with contracts, not knowing where you're playing again. You are constantly living in this unknown," she reflected. "And so in that moment, I was like, trying to remember how I dealt with those situations when I just didn't know for sure if I was going to get back or if I was going to feel good."

When the opportunity for Athletes Unlimited came, Parsons wasn't quite sure she was ready, but she signed on anyway. A few weeks of preseason preparation and a four-week competition felt manageable, and it gave her a realistic goal to work toward.

"I kept saying, 'Okay, seven weeks, I can do a seven-week season,'" she explained. "At that point, I wasn't ready to commit to a seven-month season, which is what the other leagues are."

She released any expectations about her performance and focused on the process. Having a concrete goal helped during the difficult physical therapy sessions and the adjustment to motherhood. All summer, baby Ezra tagged along and became popular with her training partners.

"All the people I trained with, they loved it," she recalled. "They were like, 'Water break!' And, you know, a little baby time."

As she became satisfied with her physical progress, Parsons signed with the Omaha Supernovas ahead of the AU Pro Volleyball Championship start in Omaha. The timing felt right, and the organization's support made the decision easier.

On the court during AU, Parsons has had to adjust her style of play to match what her body is capable of now. Instead of relying on power, she's mixing up her shots on offense and returning to the crafty approach that defined her early career.

"I'm usually a little more crafty. I'll throw in a tip and find different ways to score," she explained. "So I've almost had to go back to that. I don't need to be my strongest right now. I can use the shots that I've used before pregnancy. In my mind, I'm like, 'Oh, I have to get strong again. I have to get powerful again.' But that will come the more that I play."

Even with the challenges that come with her return to the court, the AU experience has exceeded her expectations. When she arrived at her hotel room in Omaha, she found it prepped with a high chair for Ezra. That small gesture represented the larger support system she's found throughout the competition. Even her AU teammates have become built-in babysitters who jump at the chance to spend time with the now nine-month-old.

"The relationships that are already built here, and just the quality of people that are here, and also the quality of play too...It's really competitive, and it's just so fun to even be in a practice, getting reps with these girls and getting stronger as a player and learning from other people," Parsons said. "The way that I'm able to move is still a work in progress. I'm definitely not there yet, but the people have just made it so worth it already."

Now she's soaking in every moment as she shares this chapter with her husband and son.

"Being able to play a match and immediately go off and I get to hug my baby--this is literally a dream come true," she said. "Or I even see him during the game, or I hear his sounds, because I just know his little voice. It's really so special."

Parsons has a little extra motivation on the court as well. She's playing for Athletes in Action as her Athlete Cause, the ministry where she met her husband years ago at Ultimate Training Camp.

"We still love, whenever we have the chance to go down to campus or go to one of their events, we'll still really make it a priority to get to go do that," she explained. "So to be able to have that be my cause here just made sense, and it was nice to have a story behind it too."

For other players considering a return to professional volleyball after having children, Parsons' advice centers on patience and grace. She's looked to players like Carli Lloyd and Foluke Akinradewo as inspiration, and now finds herself in a position to be that example for others.

"Your body just changes," she explained. "I feel like my body probably won't ever go back to exactly how I was before pregnancy, and I had to learn how to be patient with that."

The growth of professional volleyball leagues in the U.S. has made this path more feasible than ever before.

"Now that there are so many leagues in the U.S., it is an option, and it's so doable now, which I think is really, really cool for the sport and for women's sports in general," she said. "I would encourage anyone to do it if they have the desire."

After AU wraps, Parsons will transition directly into her next chapter with the Supernovas. She's already gotten to know Omaha during the AU season. She also has some familiarity with her future coaching staff, as six of her 10 international medals came while playing under current Supernovas Head Coach Luke Slabe, who served as an assistant coach for the National Team.

But for now, Parsons is focused on AU and the memories being created with Ezra courtside.

"AU has been wonderful, and I think it was a great decision for me and for my family. I think Ezra will be able to look back on this and have a lot of really, really fun memories, and my husband, too. I think we'll look back and be like, 'This was a really cool thing to do.'"




